TAKE NOTE OF THAT OPPORTUNITY BEFORE IT ELUDES YOU!

Jesus, like any one of us, met with disappointments some of which are narrated in today's Gospel. He was on the way to Jerusalem and the Samaritans would not let him pass through their territory, since Jews and Samaritans had negative views against each other. You have heard in some countries where a Catholic to travel through a Protestant territory can cause a riot!

Along the way Jesus came across three young men, each one had an offer to make. The first man was enthusiastic, he thought Jesus was a famous man, a celebrity, and immediately he offered to follow him. When Jesus told him the real situation of discipleship, the man gave up. It teaches us that following Jesus is not necessarily comfortable.

Then Jesus saw another suitable candidate and said to him: "Follow me". What a great chance to be called by the Lord himself. He was not calling this man to join a religion, to attend a series of meetings or to accept the values related to spiritual life. Jesus was calling him to Life itself, to become his personal assistant. The man had other priorities, his family meant much more than following a Galilean preacher. His father was not dead, but taking care of him and his estate was important. This gives us an example how we can put things about God in the second place instead of putting them first. You might have heard someone saying I will consider the priesthood when I retire or I will go to the Convent if I don't get married etc.

The third man was ready to follow Jesus but needed the opinion of his parents, as if the call was theirs. He had not enjoyed the world enough. He wanted to have the last dance, the last drink, or to say goodbye to his old habits. These men lost the chance. Following Jesus does not admit volunteers. We are not doing God a favour by believing in him, we are not doing anyone a favour by attending the Sunday Mass. It is for your own good, for your personal sanctification that you do all these things. The faith you profess and the prayers you say are for your good.

Jesus teaches another interesting point. To follow him requires real commitment. He used an image from everyday life to show the danger that can arise if we do not pay attention to this. A farmer ploughing. The heavy plough demands attention not only for the animals that pull it, but also for the farmer that directs it. No farmer can plough in a straight line if he keeps turning round to look behind him. The message is clear, we cannot follow Christ if we now and then take our eyes off him or else we will lose sight of him. We are not trying out things; to be Christians, to be married, to be priests or to be parishioners. That is what we are. Once the opportunity comes and you do not grab it, it is gone never to be retrieved!

As you return home today, go and be firm and resolute in following Jesus, there is no turning back, we are not giving a trial. Blessed is the person who has taken firm resolution to follow the Lord.
