OUR LORD JESUS CHRIST, UNIVERSAL KING

He is to be king until he has made his enemies his footstool, the last enemy to be destroyed is death (1st Cor. 15:25). Today, we acclaim Our Lord Jesus Christ King over all things that are in time and space and therefore ruler over all peoples. This solemnity summarises the mysteries of our faith in the incarnation of the begotten Son



of God who is 'true God from true God, Light from Light, begotten not made, and consubstantial with the Father' (The Creed). He is the one who 'emptied himself taking the form of a slave becoming as all human beings are' (Phil. 2:7). He shared our fragile nature to raise us to share in his divinity (Liturgy). He is the shepherd King who looks for the lost, brings back the stray, bandages the wounded and makes the weak strong (Ez. 34); and he leads all to the kingdom of his Father so that they will have fullness of life (John, 10:10).

Our King is the universal judge, and his verdict will be based on the Law of Love of the neighbours particularly the vulnerable and most needy: the hungry, the thirsty, strangers, the naked, the sick and those in prison (Matthew, 25). This means that his rule is the rule of love and mercy that must prevail in the world but must be made visible through his disciples, in the very life of the Church. This explains how the Church participates in the kingship of Christ, the Universal King. We can also judge the world when we are close to His ideals.

It is fitting that today we celebrate World Youth Sunday, as we encourage our youth to look to Christ the Universal King and seek to make their presence real in our world. We join Pope Francis to pray that the youth in our parish, as in all the world, will daily open their hearts and rejoice in encountering Christ the gentle Shepherd.

As a parish Community, we thank God for the faith of Fr. Jimmy Lutwama, AJ, whose priestly ministry is inspirational. We can testify that he is guided by the specific Charism of the Religious Missionary Institute of the Apostle of Jesus. This invites us to make conscious efforts to imitate the compassionate, active, and joyful zeal of the Heart of Christ for the lost sheep (John, 10:1-21). We are praying that God will sustain him in his new parish: Our Lady of the Angels, Nuneaton.
