KEEP AWAY FROM THIS TEMPTATION

The readings today have spoken to us about the wisdom of God and how his plans are mysterious. Who could ever know the mind of the Lord or give him advice, or correct him on what we human beings see as mistake! God has a reason for whatever he allows to take place in our life, and it is for our good.

Thanks to the telephone calls, text messages, emails and personal visits I have received from many of you since I announced last Sunday that I will leave the parish on 3rd Sept 2023. Some of you have said that they are disappointed by my departure. As a matter of fact, you should be happy that someone who was sent to you has finished his term of office. We never get disappointed to see our children getting married and start their own homes, do we? Do we get upset because the bridegroom and the bride have said "I DO" to each other? Yet we know that these words take them away from their families to go to start their own. Something of the kind is taking place in our parish.

In the gospel Jesus asked the apostles: "who do the people say the Son of Man is"? He was not conducting an opinion poll or trying to see how popular he was in the region of Caesarea Philippi. He wanted to make sure that the Apostles had the right knowledge of who he was. Some say..., some say..., others say.... These answers revealed two points:

First, that the people who observed Christ's ministry held him in high regard. They did not think of him to be a lunatic or a religious fanatic. They equated him to the great prophets in their history Elijah, Jeremiah, John the Baptist.

Second there was some confusion about the true identity of Jesus among the people.

In the changes that take place in our life

we must not lose the identity of Jesus and his plan in our life, in the parish and in the church. Do not follow the messenger but follow the one who sends him.

In the last 15 years and 6 months we have confessed Jesus as the Christ, let us continue doing so. It is not time to migrate to other parishes, keep away from this temptation because your mission, your calling is here at St. Mary's. You must take the parish into your hands, take the steering wheel, engage the gears, apply the breaks, don't overspeed or hold back the traffic. Jesus is with us in the boat, do not be afraid we shall safely reach the shore.

Missionaries are like the frontline of the army in a battle, their work is to extend the frontiers captured from the enemy. Diocesan priests are like the occupying force of the conquered territory. You should be happy that your priest has been sent to the frontline. Pray for him for a successful battle. Stay at St. Marys, build it because it is your duty to do so.
