

IF WE KEEP ON PRAYING GOD WILL SHOW US HIS MERCY:

People around the world have had different reactions and interpretation of the Corona virus pandemic. I remember someone who called it a 'hoax' but we all know that it is real. I remember watching a WhatsApp video clip that showed so many bats in China living in residential house roofing, but we all know that the people who are dying now of this virus might not have ever seen a bat in their lives. There has never been a moment in human history when the whole world is brought on its knees than this one; not even the detonation of nuclear bombs regrettable as it was!

The Bible reminds us that plagues are some of the means that God used to beacon on people to change their lives plagues came as a consequence of disobedience and idolatry.

Exodus 32:35 "On the day of my visitation I shall punish them for their sins. And Yahweh punished the people for moulding the calf that Aaron had made."

Whether Corona virus is man made by somebody in the laboratory, or it is an accidental development out of our changed, damaged and polluted planet, we should remember that God's hand to discipline us is not far from us:

Matters of Importance

The closing of churches and chapels: offers us Christians a wonderful opportunity to congregate as families within our homes to say our prayers together. God is telling us that prayer is not an activity we do in a building we call a church, but that going to church, is a fruit that blossoms out of the faith practiced at home.

In the early Church when Christians were faced with persecution, they shifted the church from the synagogues into the homes where they continued to pray and to break bread (the Lord’s Supper). The homes of suspected Christians attracted attention of the persecutors and they were targeted. The Christians did not give up the faith instead they dug up caves (catacombs) where they hid for 300 years! They tried whatever means they could to keep the faith. Their sufferings were by no means deterrents to believe and to trust in God.

As we remain locked down we come to realise how much we need each other and how much we depend on one another. We realise that we are vulnerable since the fate of one of us, can be the fate of all of us! In your homes please continue to persevere in prayer like the Apostles in the Upper Room, eventually a new Pentecost will dawn on us.

Dispensation from Easter Duties In their letter of Dispensation 18th March 2020, the President and the Vice-President of the Catholic Bishops’ Conference of England and Wales said “in these emergency circumstances, and for as long as they last, the obligation to attend Mass on Sundays and Holy Days is removed. This is, without doubt, the teaching of the Church (Catechism of the Catholic Church 2181). This pandemic is the 'serious reason' why this obligation does not apply at this time.” Many of the faithful will be aware of their Easter Duties; that is to receive Holy Communion during the Easter Season and by custom, to celebrate the Sacrament of Reconciliation beforehand. The Code of Canon Law (CIC 920) says each of the faithful is obliged to receive Holy Communion at least once a year. This precept must be fulfilled during the Easter season unless it is fulfilled for a just cause at another time during the year. The requirement for the celebration of the Sacrament of Reconciliation comes from the need to be in a state of grace to receive Holy Communion (CIC 916). Since it is not possible for the faithful to receive Holy Communion at this time, and into the future, the Bishops of England and Wales have dispensed the Easter Duties for the year 2020.

Our Faith ought to grow stronger: when people think of the Catholic faith, or the Catholic Church, some ideas come to mind of her beliefs, her history, her architecture, her art, her charity, her saints and her sinful members. However, the Church’s deepest identity is to be found in Jesus Christ and her faithfulness to Him. The Church is the communion of those whom God is saving through Christ. Whatever happens in the world, it has God’s salvific plan. Who could think that Joseph’s tears being sold by his brothers could eventually save their lives? Who ever imagined that the wood of death could become a wood of life? Do not be afraid for God is with us.
