I HAVE GIVEN THEM THE GLORY YOU GAVE TO ME

The prayer of Jesus for his followers has traditionary been known as "the priestly prayer of Christ" It represents not only what according to John's Gospel was the substance of Jesus' prayer at the Last Supper, but also the prayer that he continues to offer as the ascended High Priest in heaven. The Priestly prayer of Christ, covers the whole 17th Chapter of John's Gospel. Jesus knew that he had finished the work his Father gave him to do, it was time to return. He was aware that he was leaving his disciples in the world, so, he set himself to pray for them.

The prayer of Jesus reveals to us how much he loved his apostles and how much he loves us for that matter. "I kept those you had given me true to your name, I have watched over them and not one is lost" he prayed. How beautiful that each one of us can look back at himself/ herself in the evening of life and say I have kept those that you gave me true to your name.
