YOU WERE INVITED HAVE YOU RESPONDED?

The mysteries of our salvation are centred on Christ. On Easter we celebrated His Resurrection from the dead. On the following Sunday after Easter, we celebrated His Mercy the Divine Mercy Sunday. On the Third Sunday we celebrated Christ who walks with us especially in difficult times. The story of the disciples on the road to Emmaus were at the critical moment of their life, but as Christ joined them, their lives started to be inwardly renewed and totally transformed at the breaking of the bread.

On this Fourth Sunday, we celebrate Jesus Christ as our shepherd. Jesus is not every shepherd, but The Good Shepherd. So, today is Good shepherd Sunday. By baptism, Jesus placed us into his fold, we belong to him, whether we believe it or not, he chose you because he wants to save you for eternal life. When you reflect on this mysterious plan of Christ for you or for us as baptised, we come to realise that Jesus is the Only Gate through which we must pass to have eternal life.

In the gospel, Jesus has spoken of himself as the Gate; and there is no any other Gate, you can pass through, using either short cut, bribery, nepotism, titles or force. I'm the Gate he says. Just as all of us passed through that door of the church to come here, Jesus is the only gate through which we can pass to come into God's presence. It is important that we know the gatekeeper and that he knows us the sheep of his flock.

This Good shepherd Sunday Jesus reminds us that we too are called to be shepherds. You are called to be your brother, your sisters keeper, to guide him, to lead him to the Gate—Jesus Christ. So, this Sunday is also known as Vocation Sunday, when we are reminded that God has given each one of us a special call, to do something for our brothers and sisters, so that through our action, they may come to know, love, and serve Jesus Christ.

Every parish priest is surprised to see how only a handful of people in the parish can voluntarily use their expertise to do things in the church without being asked. Most people wait to be asked or officially invited. Someone told me, oh Father you did not invite us for Easter celebrations, another said you did not invite us for the bazaar last year,' yet another told me just this morning Father, I'm still waiting for you to invite me to come and help to clean the church. To all these people I replied, "sorry I have not invited you because you received the invitation your baptismal card. The baptism card you received is not a paper to be kept home but a testimonial document that you are invited to every activity in the church and of the church. There is no any other invitation you will receive apart from that, that you have received in baptism. It opened up for you every avenue to do good and gave you authority in the name of Jesus to be a good shepherd to your brothers and sisters after his own example. So, you were invited to do all these things, have you responded yet or not?

Gospel Reflection

Jesus said: "Amen, amen, I say to you, whoever enters through the gate is the shepherd of the sheep. The gatekeeper opens it for him, and the sheep hear his voice, as the shepherd calls his own sheep by name and leads them out." John 10:2–3

Jesus continued his teaching by saying that He is not only the Shepherd whose voice is known by the sheep, but He is also the gate. "I am the gate. Whoever enters through me will be saved, and will come in and go out and find pasture." What does our Lord mean when He calls Himself the gate? As the Gate, He is the Word of God, revealed to us through the Scriptures.

He is the gate, not only for the sheep but for each of the sheepherds who lead the sheep in His name. Let us reflect, today, upon the image of Christ the Good Shepherd, calling to us in a variety of ways. We must learn His true voice through faith and prayer. Once we recognize His voice, we will more easily discover Him ministering to us, inspiring us, and inviting us to the life of grace by encountering Him as the source and way to this new life.
