ADVENT: A JOYFUL EXPECTANCY

We have at one time expected the arrival of a beloved guest: it could be a member of the family who had travelled or a bishop visiting our parish to confer the Sacrament of Confirmation. I remember a time when my parents invited guests to our home. Weeks leading to the day were exciting, as I looked forward to the D-day, my attention was focused to the future. For us Christians, waiting has rich meanings attached to waiting in hope.

This first Sunday of Advent marks the beginning of the New Ecclesiastical Year 2023 -2024, Cycle B for Sunday readings, and Cycle II for weekdays. In the spirit of joyful gratitude, I bring to each one of you 'Happy New Year Greetings'. Our Year has four Christ-centred seasons: Advent, Christmastide, Lent, Eastertide, and Ordinary Time (in two parts).

The English word 'Advent' is derived from the Latin term 'Adventus' and in (Greek Apantesis) which means 'the arrival' or 'the coming'. In the period of the late antiquity of the Roman Empire, adventus was a ceremony that celebrated the arrival to a city of the Roman Emperor or another dignitary; it also celebrated the blessings of the imperial presence to the city's security. It was an occasion worth waiting for with much hope. The people of the city thoroughly prepared for the day.

For us the baptised, the season focuses us on the three comings of the Lord: the first coming at Bethlehem; the second is the last day or end of time, the day of judgment, and the third is in-between, the coming of our Lord in our lives now in the Church and Sacraments. As people who wait for the coming of the Lord, we must pay attention to our spiritual life. Today's Gospel reading focuses our attention on the coming of the Lord whose arrival time we do not know. To those who are prepared, he will bring blessedness to their lives. It is only those who are ready to receive him that will benefit from his arrival, but because we do not know when he is coming, therefore the caution, 'Stay awake' (Mark, 13:37).

In our parish we have several activities laid out for our spiritual preparation, which include: the Christmas Concert to take place on Saturday 16th December (5pm – 8pm); a penitential service to take place on Wednesday 20th December 2023, (7pm). Confessions will be available thereafter; additionally, confessions will be available on Tuesdays to Saturdays of Advent at 10am - 11am (after the Holy Mass). Plan to take advantage of these moments for a personal repentance. I also invite you to use those moments to discuss difficult questions and dilemmas about situations that trouble your Christian and prayer life. Our gentle prayer is: 'Lord, increase our strength of the will for doing good that Christ may find an eager welcome at his coming. Amen'.
