MEANINGFUL LABOUR

Experience shows that we are eager to start working on our first job to gain experience, grow our skills, contribute to other people's lives, and earn a salary to gain financial independence. After a few years of doing the same things, the original excitement disappears, and we are stuck in the monotonous routine of encountering similar situations. At some point, we may wonder if our work is still meaningful and adds value to other people's lives.

Today, we gain fresh insights into our work when we look at the Word of God. The author of Job, a wisdom book, commented on the human condition of his time and the labour-related experiences. He described daily labour as meaningless in terms of hard service, hired drudgery and a form of slavery. He noted that the short life a person spends on earth is characterised by meaningless labour. We pose a question if human labour should be defined like that.

Our Lord Jesus Christ provides a helpful answer to that question; he did not work for a salary, but his daily labour was very meaningful because it enriched other people's lives. He availed himself to heal the sick, cast out devils, preach the kingdom of God, and prayed daily. It is refreshing to read: 'In the morning, long before dawn, he got up and left the house, and went to a lonely place and prayed there' (Mk, 3:35).

Paul, emulating our Lord, embraced the preaching of the gospel as his daily duty. He got so committed to it that he clearly stated: 'I should be punished if I did not preach the Gospel' (1Cor. 9:16).

How about you and me, how do we see our daily labour? Is it meaningless service or some form of slavery, that we owe our supervisors?

God created us in his image; we share in his work of creation by our labours. When we render services of love to our neighbours we share in Christ's ministries of healing and teaching about the kingdom of God. Approaching our labour in this way, becomes an expression of our faith in God and a living sacrifice of praise. When we perform our daily labour with faith in God, it becomes meaningful and rewarding to us the labourers.
