GOD CREATED MAN IN HIS OWN IMAGE AND LIKENESS

The Solemnity of the Most Holy Trinity, is one of those feasts in the Church which is based not on the person like Jesus Christ, or on an event such as Pentecost which we celebrated last Sunday, or on a place. It is founded on a teaching that God has revealed himself as a Creator, as a Saviour and as a Sanctifier. This teaching was revealed by Jesus Christ himself or otherwise we would not have known it.

The Catholic catechism teaches us that we are created in the image of the Most Holy Trinity. God has created us, such that we have the capacity of intellect that is to understand things, the capacity to remember things (memory) and the capacity to will. These three functions of the soul, distinguish us from the rest of creatures making us truly created in the image and likeness of God.

Jesus spoke to his disciples about the Father who sent him, about the Father who loves the Son, about the Father into whose hands he surrendered his spirit as he died on the cross.

Jesus spoke of himself as the beloved Son sent by the Father rejected by vineyard tenants. After his resurrection he commissioned the disciples by telling them that "as the Father sent me, so I am sending you." He told them to go to teach and to baptise "in the name of the Father, and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit". Jesus would have said baptise them in the name of the Father alone or of the Son alone but he told them to make disciples by teaching them of a God who created them, saved them and has made them a holy people.

Since the mystery of the Most Holy Trinity is a based on a teaching, it is so deep that our limited human intellect cannot grasp, but it reminds us that as Christians, we have the life of God within us. Some aspects of nature reveal the Trinity. Water, can exist as ice, as liquid, or as steam yet remaining the same. To explain this mystery, St. Patrick used the shamrock leaf.

As you return home I ask you to remember that you have been consecrated to the Most Holy Trinity so that the life of God himself may be at work in you. He created you in his own image and likeness.
