LOOK BEYOND AND SEE, GOD IS REALLY WITH US

When I read the story of Abraham, I get strengthened in my life because it reminds me that God has a plan. But this plan is hidden from our vision and from our knowledge. We reach it by cooperating daily with the grace of God at work in us.

Abraham was a rich man, with property but he had no children. At about the age of 75, he was asked by his God to leave his country and go to the country he would show him. His God did not show him the land he was taking him to, he just asked him to cooperate. We shall never have a full picture of what God is doing with us or what he wants us to do with us.

This experience comes out clearly in the Gospel. Peter, James and John were led by Jesus to the mountain; for the three men, it was possibly one of the walks with Jesus; but for Jesus the plan was to prepare them for the scandal of the cross by revealing to them his glory. Yes, God has a plan, our not knowing it does not mean that it does not exist.

During this Lenten season, we are reminded of the mysterious plans of God. Dying on the cross could not be the best choice for the beloved Son. Yet the Father allowed it. Captive slaves returning home through the middle of the Red Sea was not the safest route to take, yet God planned that it was the best option. Freeing captives from Egyptian slavery and keep them wandering in the desert until they all died including Moses, was not true liberation, yet for God that was the best way to teach them that he was their Saviour! To tell an old man Abraham and Sara that he will be the father of multitudes was impossible dream, but it was the best way to teach them that he was a faithful God who kept his promise. Yes, indeed *God has a plan*.

When we discover that God has a plan, then our worries no longer have control over us, what we consider as dangers turn to appear as providential moments and opportunities in life. In the gospel we have heard those beautiful words of Peter "Lord, it is wonderful for us to be here" but the same Peter had been panicking with fear as they were covered in a dark cloud. Whichever situation we may be, there will be something to marvel about and, to thank God for, because *God has a plan*.

St. Paul writing to Timothy in the second reading has said: with me bear the hardships for the sake of the Good News. Sometimes it is important to look beyond our difficulties and instead see that *God has a plan* and is present to us all the time even in difficult moments.

As you return home today, take the call of the voice of the Father which said: "this is my beloved Son, listen to him." Yes, if we listen to Jesus, we shall find meaning in every circumstances of our life.
