# THEY DO NOT PRACTICE WHAT THEY PREACH (Matthew, 23:3).

The Catechism of the Catholic Church presents us with two complementary types of priesthood, namely, the common priesthood and ministerial priesthood (See Catechism, nos. 1546 &1547).

The Sacrament of Orders makes of a Catholic priest another Christ: what a dignity! It is an uphill task that must be sustained by daily prayer, listening to the Word of God, celebrating the Sacraments, seeking holiness, and actively witnessing the mystery of Christ, the High Priest (See Heb. 5). A priest should consciously seek the integrity that harmonizes his preaching and way of life. He must be aware that his actions speak loudly as his words.

History reveals moments when the image of priests has been damaged and time and again prophets arose and called them to order. In today's Word of God, we read of Prophet Malachi admonishing priests to change from their scandalous ways. In Matthew 23, Jesus' critical statements about the scribes and pharisees (priests) was another form of warning. He encouraged the faithful to listen and obey their preaching because they represented the authority of Moses.

Jesus, however, slapped the priests in the face when he instructed, 'Do not be guided by what they do, since they do not practice what they preach (Mat.23:3). In this, he pointed to the hypocrisy of their lives. It is perhaps because of their selfishness that they neglected the burden of their calling to harmonise their actions with their preaching. Our Lord's message is relevant not only to the Catholic priests of our day, but also to all the Christian faithful who share in the common priesthood of Christ.

An awareness of the Christian dignity in the common priesthood raises one's consciousness for the need of a life of integrity and constant search for holiness. Both types of priesthood complement each other, as each in their positions, strives for a life of holiness that upholds the true image of the Catholic Church, the Body of Christ.

Dear brothers and sisters in Christ, today's readings, and particularly the Gospel, leave us with a challenge of questioning ourselves how we live our priesthood.
