LET US FIX OUR EYES ON JESUS TO DISCOVER THE GLORY WE ARE MADE FOR.

The transfiguration of Jesus in the presence of his disciples was meant to enable them to remain strong, when they would see him at his weakest moment, starting from the Garden of Gethsemane, to his hanging on the cross on Mt. Calvary. I'm sure you have heard the song which invites us not lose faith in God 'when things go wrong because the God on the mountains, is the same God in the valley'.

Peter, James and John were now on the Mountain seeing Jesus in glory. They were at their best, that Peter exclaimed: "*it is wonderful for us to be here*" but as we know, a time came when Jesus was not on the mountain but in the Kendrod valley in the garden of despair and agony Gethsemane. It was the same Jesus, the same Lord, the same Saviour. As a pilgrim people on this earth and as Christians, we spend our life between those two places of Ups and Downs. In which ever place we might be, the voice of the Father tells us to *'listen to Jesus his beloved Son*,' or else we would be overcome with fear. Sometimes our life is covered with deep shadow, but we should never forget that the light of Christ eventually shines upon us soon or later.

The second reading is one of those pieces that give us firm certainty of what we believe and proclaim. St. Peter the principle witness to the coming of Christ said: "*It* was not any cleverly invented myth that we were repeating when we brought you the knowledge of the power of Jesus. We saw his majesty ourselves."

If Jesus had not appeared in glory, the agony on the cross and his burial would have ruled out any belief in his resurrection proclaimed by the women who discovered the empty tomb. The event of his transfiguration reminded the disciples that Jesus had come from heaven. Whatever had taken place was to fulfil Israel's prophecy.

The world of God reminds us that what we Christians believe is not a fabrication of the human mind. Christianity is a revelation of God and it is through Christianity that we are called to share fully in the glory of God. It is therefore wonderful for us to be Christians and to be gathered here this morning to profess that we are a people of God.

As we return home today, let us go and build three tents in our homes: one for Jesus, one for our family and one for our neighbour. Let us ask the Lord to give us the grace to love being in his presence. "*It is wonderful for us to be here*" To have our eyes fixed on Jesus will allow us to discover the glory we are made for, the glory we are to share in, the glory that will last forever. Jesus is the beloved Son, he enjoys the favour of the Father, let us listen to him.
