Gifts for the King

I cannot talk about gifts before thanking you, dear parishioners. Thank you for the Christmas gifts that you have given to me during this Christmas season. They make me feel your love and devotion and challenge me to be more available for my pastoral ministries among you. The gifts you gave me strike a loud chord with today's feast of the Epiphany, particularly as we consider the gifts of the wise men from the East, the Magi, who offered gifts to the Baby Jesus in the Manger.

In this solemnity, we celebrate with great joy God's manifestation in the Baby Jesus to all people who were represented by the wise men from the East. The Gospel of Matthew narrates how some wise men led by a star went to Jerusalem from the East and asked where the infant king of the Jews was because they wanted to do him homage (Mt.2:1-2). They expressed their faith in the Baby Jesus whom they also regarded as their king. Although they were not Jews, they felt closely included in the salvation that Jesus brought to all peoples of all nations and generations; those include you and me.

They did him homage and expressed their love by opening their treasures and offering him gifts of gold, frankincense, and myrrh. These were precious gifts of immense meaning to the mystery of Jesus who is the Son of God, Jesus the Saviour and King of all people, the Light of the world.

We celebrate this feast as an expression of God's love for all peoples regardless of race, colour, or language. Jesus manifested himself as the Saviour for all peoples. He opened to us God's treasures of eternal love, graciousness, and mercy.

As we celebrate this feast, we intend to affirm our response to the universality of Christ's message for all people. Like the wise men from the East, we seek to recognise Christ and we are being guided by the light of the Star: our faith. We encounter Christ who reveals himself in the Community of faith, the Church; he speaks to us his Word and is present to us in the Sacraments. As we encounter Christ, let us generously open to him the treasures of our love and flow with grace as we approach him in our neighbours and in prayer.

I wish you a happy celebration of the Epiphany.
