## **MERCY AND PEACE**

Today, we are celebrating the Divine Mercy Sunday, which was instituted in the Church by Pope John Paul II on April 30th 2000, during the canonisation ceremony of Maria Faustina Kowalska. He declared the Second Sunday of Easter as Divine Mercy Sunday. In his devotion, the Pope entrusted the world to divine mercy, when in 2002, he consecrated the International Shrine of the Divine Mercy in Lagiewniki, Poland.

Standing before the image of divine mercy, the Pope said: "I wish solemnly to entrust the world to divine mercy. I do so with the burning desire that the message of God's merciful love, proclaimed here through St. Faustina, may be made known to all the peoples of the earth and fill their hearts with hope" (Website of the Catholic News Agency).

Today, we sing of God's mercies both in word and action; sung by the harmonious flow of our very lives. We thank the Lord, who in every generation reveals his mercy and love to all, but specifically in our days, he revealed his mercy to Sr. Maria Faustina of Kowalska. Through her, the Lord Jesus communicates to the world the great message of God's mercy and reveals the pattern of Christian perfection based on trust in God and on the attitude of mercy toward one's neighbours.

Mercy is a fundamental Christian disposition which testifies to a disciple's devotion to our Lord and commitment to the new commandment: 'Love one another as I have loved you' (Jn, 13:34). The attitude of mercy and compassion that we learn from God himself inspires us to generously serve the needy, proclaim the good news without counting the cost, forgive and forget wrongs done to us, reconcile warring parties and desire to work for peace.

After his resurrection, the Lord appeared several times to his frightened disciples and greeted them, 'Peace be upon you' ('Shalom aleichem' in Hebrew). The peace of a believer ensues from total trust and surrender to God the Almighty who is in total control of all situations. The mercy we obtain from God showers us with immense peace and energy to actively witness to God's goodness and be daily ambassadors of peace.

I wish you a happy Divine Mercy Sunday, and together let us recite the following verse: 'I will sing of the mercies of the Lord forever; with my mouth I will make known your faithfulness to all generations. For I have said, "Mercy shall be built up forever; your faithfulness you shall establish in the very heavens" (Ps. 89:1).
