THE PLAN TO EXPAND PRISONS FRIGHTENED ME.

Mrs Francesca suffers from complications that come with old age, she is bent at the back, her legs are no longer strong enough to support her body, her fingers suffer from acute arthritis and her eyes are so dim to see. As child who knew her, Mrs Francesca, has become a shadow of herself. During her days, she used whatever resource she had to teach children how to behave at school and how to behave when they returned home. She would say to them: "the respect and attention you give to the teachers in the school, must be taken and given to your parents and siblings in the family. The reason why I'm asking you to do this is because the Fourth Commandment tells us: "honour your father and mother."

Many children of my generation built their lives on this advice. While the school was a place where we learned the art of respecting other people who were not members of our families, the home became a place where self respect, obedience to parents, docility and selfless love were practiced without fear of punishment as it happened at school. We became the kind of men and women we are today.

Some weeks ago, I heard good news from our Prime Minister as he answered questions from the Parliament Dispatch Box: he was going to recruit twenty thousands Police Officers to keep us safe, he was going to renovate and to upgrade twenty hospitals nationwide. He was also going to create ten thousand prison spaces to lock up offenders. The increase of the number of Police Officers and renovation of our hospitals sounded like music in my ears, but the creation of ten thousand prison cells to lock up people left me scared.

It goes without saying that many of those who occupy our prison cells are young people. There is no indication that this trend is changing so soon. I can also guess that in the creation of ten thousands prison cells, the government is not targeting pensioners. How sad it would be for any young person to start life with a prison sentence!

On the 15th of this month, we shall celebrate our Parish Family Thanksgiving Day. Take this occasion to recognise that God has given you a family to nurture you and he has also entrusted to you a family to take care of. Let us take this occasion to get rid of lack of forgiveness and bitterness that rob our families true happiness and peace. I'm not so sure how many of us would like their child to book a room out of the ten thousands that the Prime Minister is creating. A child is born in, and to a family not to a government. Yes, disciplining him and moulding him in the values acceptable in society is hard but it will bring you real happiness when the time comes to receive your dividends for the hard work you did not neglect.

YOU ARE MOST WELCOME to our Parish Church. If it is your first time here or probably you have been here before, your presence with us at this moment at our community worship is greatly appreciated. Our Parish Church is the second to be built in Coventry after the Protestant Reformation. It was built in 1893, the pews have never moved since then! Our Musical Pipe Organ was inaugurated in 1898, it was the best of its kind at the time. Our Parish has had eleven Parish priests since 1889, the present one being a Religious Missionary from the Institute of Apostles of Jesus in Uganda. Our Parish welcomes and promotes the initiatives taken by everyone for the building up and sustenance of our faith community.
