

GIFT AID YOUR SUNDAY DONATION AND SEE THE DIFFERENCE:

We shall soon be reminded of our tax obligations as the tax year is coming to a close. I wish to thank all our parishioners for working hard to pay your taxes. I thank those particularly who give their Sunday donations through that Brown envelope we call Gift Aid envelopes. If you remember, I told you two years ago that the tax that the parish reclaimed from HMRC facilitated the installation of a new heating system in our church. Thank God the church is warm all of us are happy.

Your donation could make an even bigger impact at no extra cost to you. Gifts from UK taxpayers qualify for Gift Aid. This means that for every £1 you give to the church, the parish can claim an extra 25p. For example, a gift of £20.00 means we can reclaim £5.00 making your gift worth £25.00. It won't cost you a single penny more, but it will support the parish more.

Do I qualify for Gift Aid? To qualify, you must be a UK taxpayer who has paid income or capital gains tax equal to the tax that will be claimed on your donation. For example, if you donate £100 in the current tax year, you need to have paid £25 in tax to match the amount that the parish will claim in Gift Aid.

You are a taxpayer if: tax is taken from your wages at source (ie PAYE) or if you fill out a self-assessment form, or if you have any taxable savings (in a building society, for instance), or a pension plan, or investment income you have paid capital gains tax, or expect to pay it in the near future.

How do I sign up to Gift Aid? It's very easy – all you have to do is sign a Gift Aid declaration form. A Gift Aid declaration is a statement by an individual taxpayer that they want a charity (the parish) to receive the tax paid on their donation back from the government. Forms can be obtained at the back of the church from Sr. Leera Lobo

What does the Gift Aid declaration commit me to? <u>Nothing</u> – it just ensures that if you choose to make your Sunday donation to the church the parish can claim an extra 25% back from HM Revenue & Customs.

What do I do if I my tax status changes or I want to cancel my declaration? Please advise us as soon as possible if your circumstances change, if you stop paying tax or if you wish to cancel your declaration. To help us keep our records up to date, please let us know if you move house or any of your details change. Gift Aid works, how I wish all of you taxpayers joined it today! For more information speak to Fr. Jimmy the parish priest or to Sr. Leera Lobo our Gift Aid Organiser.

YOU ARE MOST WELCOME to our Parish Church. If it is your first time here or probably you have been here before, your presence with us at this moment at our community worship is greatly appreciated. Our Parish Church is the second to be built in Coventry after the Protestant Reformation. It was built in 1893, the pews have never moved since then! Our Musical Pipe Organ was inaugurated in 1898, it was the best of its kind at the time. Our Parish has had eleven Parish priests since 1889, the present one being a Religious Missionary from the Institute of Apostles of Jesus in Uganda. Our Parish welcomes and promotes the initiatives taken by everyone for the building up and sustenance of our faith community.
