DISCIPLINE IS A KEY TO GREATER THINGS

Discipline is a quality of living that guarantees success. It demands following a pattern of life, keeping a particular company, reading certain books, observing a particular diet among other things. An undisciplined person is friend of none. Families with children who take disciplining them from the start as a joyful duty, are likely to live a happy life in their old age. In the same way, children who positively accept the discipline they receive from their parents, grow up with feelings of obligations towards them, even though they may already have assumed obligations similar to what their parents have. Discipline is a key to success no matter the difficulties that may be involved.

Jesus demanded discipline from everyone who wanted to become his follower, a discipline that is demanded of every Christian to the present day. It is this: "*if anyone wants to be a follower of mine, let him renounce himself, take up his cross every day and follow me.*" Mt.16:24. For those who had already become his followers, he gave them a new commandment: "*Love one another as I have loved you, by your love they will know that you are my disciples.*" Jn.13:35. This teaching calls for discipline of a certain kind.

In the second reading today, St. Paul speaks about his personal discipline as a follower of Christ. As a faithful disciple, he had mastered how to be poor, or how to be rich, whether he was well provided for, or lacked bare necessities of life, there was nothing that he could not master with the help of God who gave him strength.

As Christians, we are also called upon to learn the art of fidelity to Christ in such a way that we can remain with him in which ever situation we might be. Jesus did not promise us that we shall not be touched by the trials of life, but in all these, he expects us to be faithful to him. Fidelity is that wedding garment that Jesus speaks about in the Gospel today. While every person from crossroads, street corners and alleyways was called to the wedding hall, it was still necessary that they had observed a certain etiquette namely putting on a wedding garment (fidelity).

Let us always observe our Christian discipline as Jesus Christ expects of us, because that is what makes us to be known as his followers in this world. A person without discipline should never expect happiness or progress.
