JOB VACANCY

On Tuesday last week there was a Job vacancy announced in the church for the first time. This was not a hoax but a genuine job offer because it was advertised by the top executive officer himself, Simon Peter from Galilee. The job was advertised in his words as he addressed the community of believers in Jesus . From the moment the Apostles discovered that the tomb was empty and that Jesus's body was not stolen (as some Jews were saying) but that he had indeed risen and was appearing to them alive, until then Peter had been addressing the Jewish leaders sometimes accusing them of killing Jesus the stone that had been rejected by the builders which had now become the corner stone. Peter regrettably admitted that one of their own number had offered himself as a guide to the men who arrested Jesus. This man Judas took his own life and it was time to have him replaced. The job description was clear: the candidate must witness to the resurrection of Jesus.

What were the qualifications that a suitable candidate had to have?

Someone who has *been with us* the whole time that the Lord Jesus was *travelling round with us*, someone who *was with us* right from the time when John was baptizing until the day when Jesus was *taken up from us*— and he can *act with us* as a witness to his resurrection."

The cutting edge was constancy, fidelity, belongingness, someone who knew how things had evolved and who was willing to take the community ahead in its faith in the Risen Jesus.

I looked at this job offer and I wondered how many contemporary Christians would get it. Many would not apply because they fell away from the church long ago, to the extent that they may not be aware that such job offer exists. Others would not qualify because they follow Jesus at those moments when they feel that they need him. But let each person ask oneself: This job is being advertised to replace Judas Iscariot and to be numbered among the Twelve Apostles; given the criteria that is set, would I qualify as a possible candidate?

YOU ARE MOST WELCOME to our Parish Church. If it is your first time here or probably you have been here before, your presence with us at this moment at our community worship is greatly appreciated. Our Parish Church is the second to be built in Coventry after the Protestant Reformation. It was built in 1893, the pews have never moved since then! Our Parish has had eleven Parish priests since 1889, the present one being a Religious Missionary from the Institute of Apostles of Jesus in Uganda. Our Parish welcomes and promotes the initiatives taken by everyone for the building up and sustenance of our faith community.
