Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

MAKE UP THE DIFFERENCES BETWEEN YOU INSTEAD OF DISAGREEING AMONG YOURSELVES.

The Catholic Church has designated today as Sunday of the Word of God, encouraging us to reflect on the gift of the Scriptures. The Bible, and especially the four Gospels, witnesses to the coming of the eternal Son of God as the Word made fresh. It is our privilege to receive the Scriptures to read and reflect on them, and it is our task to share them with others as missionary disciples of the Lord.

The Word of God forms us as we listen to it together at Mass. We are grateful when our priests and deacons share their understanding of the Scriptures and the insights of their experience in the homily. This deepens our love of the Word of God and allows it to influence our lives. The Holy Spirit is at work in those who preach and in us as we listen. It is good when the preacher receives a considered response to his preaching. Pastoral Letters too benefit from charitable criticism from time to time - but don't, please, all write at once!

The Word of God gathers us together, and unites us as we listen to its message. This work of gathering is completed in the Mass as we receive the Eucharist. The Eucharist that we receive, transforms us into a people in union with one another. As Catholics we believe that the Eucharist is both a sign and an instrument of our communion, our unity, making it visible and deepening it, making it fruitful. Apart from being the Sunday of the Word of God, this Sunday also falls within the Octave of Prayer for Christian Unity. We recall the prayer of Our Lord in St John's Gospel, that his followers may all be one. The quest for Christian Unity is not peripheral to our lives as Catholics - it is an intrinsic part of our mission and it lies within the DNA of an authentic Catholic identity. When we profess our belief, in the Nicene Creed, in One, Holy, Catholic and Apostolic Church, we are acknowledging the gift of unity which has been entrusted to us in its fulness as Catholics. But we are given a task to build up our unity with other baptised Christians, with other churches and Christian communities, through our baptism, our shared reverence for the Word of God, and through our mission to evangelise. While this unity is real it remains incomplete. This undermines the effectiveness of our preaching of the Gospel - it weakens the impact of our work for unity and peace.

St. Paul's First Letter to the Corinthians says: *make up the differences between you...be united again in your belief and practice.* The need to resolve our differences reflects our human condition, that we are not perfect. The best way to help the world to s Cont....pg 3.

Gospel Reflection

In Matthew's Gospel, from which we read today, we hear the first words spoken by our Lord as He begins His public ministry: "Repent, for the kingdom of heaven is at hand."

Jesus adds something that John could not: "The kingdom of heaven is at hand."

As Jesus begins His preaching, His words are challenging but also very hopeful. By saying that "the kingdom of heaven is at hand," Jesus stirs interest and holy curiosity among His first listeners. His call to repentance was softened by His new proclamation about the Kingdom.

One helpful insight we can take from these first words of Jesus' public ministry is that this is the best way to share the Gospel with those who do not yet follow Christ. As you ponder this, think about those in your life who also need this initial sense of hope and holy curiosity about the Gospel.
