LET YOUR DECISIONS BE INSPIRED BY THE HOLY SPIRIT?

During the week, the readings at Mass spoke about the great decision which changed the way the first Christians looked at themselves. It concerned a matter of no little controversy. Christianity had sprung from Judaism, but now Gentiles /pagans were also coming to believe the Good News. Differences of opinion had also sprung up: must Gentiles be circumcised before they were accepted into Christianity or not? The disagreement over circumcision was so serious that Paul and Barnabas travelled from Antioch to Jerusalem (about three hundred miles) to seek its resolution.

Each side of the debate had valid viewpoints. Surely, pagans were not descended from Abraham, but Jesus had also commanded them to go to the whole world and proclaim the Good News. He did not command them to preach exclusively to the Jews but to all people. But rather than split up the early Church because of difference of opinions, the Apostles and elders sat down together to discuss the matter. Together, they considered the issues carefully. Together they prayed. Together they took a decision guided by the Holy Spirit. They left a model for us to copy.

The Church is a family of believers. It lives in time, so it has to respond according to the needs and signs of the time. In the past 2022 years, of her existence, Christians have never been far from disagreements sometimes based on who should lead her, or what should be taught, or what discipline should be observed. If you are looking for a church where there will be difference of opinion, or a parish where there will be no differences, you are very much mistaken. But how should we handle the differences between us?

The first leaders of the Church, made extraordinary journeys to go to seek clarification, to explain facts and to support each other. None of them abandoned the Church, but they worked together to find ways of responding to their difficulties. Resolving differences that threaten to cause conflict or division requires patience and charity. It requires peace and a confidence that God will guide the discussions. It demands self-control to listen to another point of view without jumping in to shoot it down. It is not enough and not an answer to walk away.

The decision that was taken by the early Christians came about after prayer and listening to the prompting of the Holy Spirit that they could say: "It has been decided by the Holy Spirit and by ourselves" to remind us that before we take decisions, we need to pray hard about it. Many mistakes we make in our relationships are caused by the fact that we do not pray first or seek guidance from above.

As you return home today, and as we wait for the coming of the Holy Spirit, I ask you to recall the Sacrament of Confirmation you received. The Spirit of wisdom and understanding are available to guide you, in issues that threaten to cause discord. The Holy Spirit in you will give you patience to take time to pray over difficulties; will give you peace to calmly consider other points of view; and self-control to keep your temper or to hold your tongue in discussions. In moments of conflict, pause to ask the Spirit for the grace to bear the appropriate fruit.
