I'm extremely pleased o celebrate the first Sunday of Lent with a brother priest, Fr. Toby Jaspher Omong who arrived on Wednesday to start his missionary work in this country. For me it is a very special moment, because as you know, I have spoken to you time and again the necessity to support the training of a missionary priest, but I never knew that one day, I will stand here at the Alter of God with one, among many seminarians that we have, as a parish, supported in his training to become a missionary priest.

As you know, I have never asked you to take a collection for this cause, but I asked you to sponsor those who volunteered charity walks to raise money, I asked you to support those who volunteered cake sales and I reminded you of the small box at the back of the Church wall to deposit your donations if you wanted to support the training of a missionary priest. Here, at this altar in this church, we have that priest sent to us. Thanks be to God.

The Word of God today has spoken about the beautiful world created by God but destroyed by sin. We are reminded that we bear within us the image of God which is his very life. "God fashioned man out of the soil and breathed into his nostrils the breath of life, and thus man became a living being". But this image, is disfigured in us because of sin or when we give in to temptations, just as Adam and Eve did. Sin is attractive and many times it is the easier option, so Jesus in the gospel reminds us that we can fight temptations and overcome them. When we give in to our personal indulgence, we run into trouble.

The three temptations of Jesus characterise the areas in our life where the devil puts his trap for a quick catch, Power, Money and Fame. For power, men and women have destroyed each other. For money men and women have ravaged the earth, and for fame men and women have lost their conscience. Jesus teaches us that worshipping these things or placing them in our life instead of God, is empty. "You must instead worship the Lord your God and serve him alone"

Throughout the Lenten season, we shall hear the Lord calling on us to change our lives and our attitudes. The Lord will invite us to love others more, to do good to them, to fast and to pray. Above all, he will ask us to forgive other people, as we need the forgiveness of God ourselves. Let us try our best to benefit spiritually from this season of grace. It is not enough to stop eating cakes, chocolates or eating beef, if you do not change your arrogance, your anger or your malice. Lent is more to your soul than to your body. Come close to God, and he will come close to you.

As you return home today, let us be a people of action, first by being vigilant against the devil and the actions he inspires in us, and also by being cautious of the devil inside our lives. I wish you all a fruitful Lenten season. And let us thank God for the gift of a new priest in our midst.
