#### AVOID BEING A PILLAR OF SALT ON A SUNDAY MORNING

Few days ago, I asked somebody whether there is a country or a continent where the Catholic Church does not exist. He thought and thought again, then he said "the Catholic Church is in every country and on every continent." I believe that you appreciate being part of a family whose teaching and values are upheld the world over.

The universality of the Catholic Church is not what makes it Catholic but the inclusion of every person, the equality and dignity of every baptised, the recognition that every baptised is a new creation, and, the unity of believers is what makes it truly Catholic. From the beginning of Christianity, men and women, Jews and Gentiles, free and slaves, citizens and immigrants, the circumcised and non circumcised, were all accepted as beloved members of the body of Christ that formed the Church. This is where the 'Catholicism' of the Church takes its name.

All over the world the Catholic Church through her Roman Rite has a uniform way of celebrating the liturgy. It does not matter where you come from or which language you speak, Catholics who practice the faith will know exactly what is going on at Mass. This is not the case with Pentecostal Churches, since there is no organised liturgy, or systematic liturgical calendar, you cannot tell exactly what the pastor is going to say or to preach about. However, there are three words that he would certainly not miss: "*Praise the Lord!*," *Alleluia!*" and *Amen*. This is not the case with Catholic liturgy which is so organised such that no matter where you are, the faithful will offer the same praise and listen to the same message from the Lord in the scriptures. If he cannot read the language he can at least respond to the parts of Holy Mass in his/her own language. A catholic cannot be lost.

It is not strange these days to go into churches and find people who came to Sunday Mass and leave without opening their mouth, they seem to be literary blind, deaf and dumb. Don't be surprised, it is very common. Well if prayer means giving praise and thanksgiving to God, I don't think that persons who God has given the gift of speech and hearing show their gratefulness when they come into his presence and appear like pillars of salt. Avoid becoming a frozen pillar of salt on a beautiful Sunday morning; endeavour to be lively and active as much as possible. Holy Mass is a celebration of Christ's victory over sin and death, therefore it is also our victory with Him, in Him and through Him. Let us proclaim it.

YOU ARE MOST WELCOME to our Parish Church. If it is your first time here or probably you have been here before, your presence with us at this moment at our community worship is greatly appreciated. Our Parish Church is the second to be built in Coventry after the Protestant Reformation. It was built in 1893, the pews have never moved since then! Our Musical Pipe Organ was inaugurated in 1898, it was the best of its kind at the time. Our Parish has had eleven Parish priests since 1889, the present one being a Religious Missionary from the Institute of Apostles of Jesus in Uganda. Our Parish welcomes and promotes the initiatives taken by everyone for the building up and sustenance of our faith community.
