As we stand at the fringes of the year 2020 and the frontiers of 2021, this is our last newsletter. I thank the readers of our parish newsletter in which I communicate to you all that I consider important for our spiritual growth and social wellbeing. As someone that composes the contents of our newsletter, you will bear me witness that its focus is not flattery or story telling, it is not reproduction of homilies or announcements but every weekly newsletter has a message; that, as your parish priest, I try to communicate for individual good and for the good of our spiritual growth.

In this newsletter, I thank you all for the support you have given the parish. Our parish is founded and built on a classless philosophy, where the existence of one is the reason for the existence of others. Here, the big contribution of the strong has the same recognition as the smallest contribution of the weakest. This philosophy has enabled our parish to be a place where every person feels at home to participate in the building up of the church. Thank you for sharing your wisdom with the parish by being creative and by advising the parish priest on what ought to be done. Thank you for sharing your financial income with the church by looking for jobs, working hard, faithfully supporting through Standing Orders and Gift Aid Scheme.

Although some churches had not recovered after the first national lockdown, our parish has slowly recovered amidst new fears. Lectors, Choristers are still willing to exercise their ministries, not to forget my altar servers who are desperately waiting for the moment when we can again do our ministry at the altar. As we start this New Year please remember Covid 19 and do your best to eliminate it by following strictly the guidelines that common sense and scientific advisers give us. Remember the chances God gives you such as the family, the job, the food you eat, the health you enjoy or the people that care about you. These are signs of God's goodness and care.

Let us now join our hands, close our eyes, lift up our voices and say the prayer Moses said before starting the final journey to the Promised Land " *If we have won your favour Lord our God, come along with us*" (Exodus 34:9). In this New Year, heal us, forgive us and give us your peace".

Welcome the New year 2021: The great thing about having a friendship with God is that there is always the opportunity to start anew - God always offers us a new day and a new dawn, no matter what has gone before. At the start of the New Year, why not take a moment to thank Him for last year, ask His forgiveness for where you have failed, and dedicate this new year to Him - to serve Him and love Him afresh.

Feast of Holy Innocents is celebrated on Monday 28th Dec. During this octave of Christmas the Church celebrates the memory of the small children of the neighborhood of Bethlehem put to death by Herod. The Holy Innocents saved the Child Jesus from death by King Herod by the shedding of their own blood. The Holy Innocents are the special patrons of small children, who can please the Christ Child by being obedient and helpful to parents, and by sharing their toys and loving their siblings and playmates. The feast of the Holy Innocents is an excellent time for parents to inaugurate the custom of blessing their children. Therefore, parents make a sign a cross on your child's forehead with the right thumb dipped in holy water and say: May God bless you, and may He be the Guardian of your heart and mind—the Father, + Son, and Holy Spirit. Amen.

Feast of Epiphany of the Lord: is celebrated on 6th January It's Holyday of obligation where in every faithful are obliged to attend the Eucharist. The word "epiphany" comes from the Greek *epiphainen*, a verb that means "to shine upon," "to manifest," or "to make known." Thus, the feast of the Epiphany celebrates the many ways that Christ has made Himself known to the world, mainly the three events that manifested the mission and divinity of Christ: the visit of the Magi (Matthew 2:1-12), the baptism of Jesus (Mark 1:9-11), and the miracle at Cana (John 2:1-11). The visit of the Magi is emphasized on Epiphany Day, and Christ's baptism is celebrated the first Sunday that follows.
