MARANNATHA COME LORD JESUS!

I welcome you all to the new season of the Church's liturgical year. Today is the first Sunday of advent, the first Sunday of the call to renew hope that Jesus will fulfil his promise to return to save us. The church reminds us from time to time that we are a pilgrim people therefore when Advent comes, the focus on our eternal destination is renewed because it is near.

Last Sunday I mentioned that men in prison look forward with great expectation to the day of their freedom, they don't fear it or feel worried about it, it is lukewarm believers who get afraid and bewildered when they talk about the return of the Lord. St. Paul has instructed the Christians at Thessalonica not to panic about the return of Jesus but to make more and more progress in knowing him and in loving him.

A person with guilty conscience will dread the return of his master; as a matter of fact such a man prays fervently that the master does not return. On the other hand a person who has been doing his best, trying and trying again despite the failures, looks with great expectations to the return of his master, he knows that he will not condemn him for the unfinished work but instead share in his frustration.

What takes place in your mind when you think about the coming of Jesus, do you feel afraid, or even wish that he does not return at all? When you think about meeting with God one day is it something that brings you joy and excitement or something that you dread? Whatever makes you and I feel fearful for the coming of the Lord, is what Advent season asks us to address.

Christianity is strongly marked by a positive understanding of the end of all time. The return of Jesus will not be a moment of terror and dire judgement instead if we keep on loving him and loving our neighbours, practicing our faith, keeping the commandments of God, the end of time and the return of the Lord is something we should long for. Jesus teaches us today that while there will be signs in the moon and in the sun, nations in agony bewildered by the clamour of the ocean and men dying of fear, those who are his own should not feel afraid instead they should hold their heads high because that will be the sign that their liberation has come.

In the meantime Jesus tells us to watch and pray. We know that many people do not believe in God, even for those who believe, we know that they do not behave as believers. Some people think that the pillars of our Christian faith are invented myth. So, Jesus warns us to watch ourselves to make sure that the consolations this world offers: debauchery, drunkenness and lure of earthly riches do not take us too.

As you return home today remember that we have been promised a great future when Jesus will come to bring the dawn of never ending day in our life. My ministry as your priest is to proclaim this promise in your hearing and to prepare you to receive it when it is fulfilled. What a wonderful day it will be when all of us assembled here today will be together in the presence of Jesus in heaven. Let us entertain this hope and long for it by our fidelity to Christ. Therefore stay awake praying at all time for the strength to survive all that is going to happen and to stand with confidence before the Son of man. Our prayer is Maranatha—Come Lord Jesus.
