THE BENEFACTORS OF JESUS

For those people who attentively listen to the Word of God being read in the Church, something strikes their hearts such that they might wonder whether they heard correctly what was read or not. When you listen to the story of how Herodias advised a child to ask for murder of John the Baptist (Mk. 6:24-25), or how a small boy David defeated a mighty warrior Goliath (1Sam. 17:48-51) you wonder! Or else how could the discovery of the resurrection of Jesus from the tomb be attributed the women (Matt.28:1-8) instead of being attributed to the apostles individually or collectively! These and many other Bible passages challenge our ordinary thinking.

The Bible speaks about the benefactors of Jesus; it was a group of women who travelled with him on His journeys; "now after this he made his way through towns and villages preaching and proclaiming the good news. With him went the twelve as well as certain women Mary surnamed the Magdalene, Joana the wife of Herod's steward Chuza, Susanna and several others who provided for them out of their own resources" Lk 8:1-3. These were the benefactors of Jesus, It shows the freedom he allowed women to have in his own ministry. He welcomed them and accepted their support.

Like the women of the Bible we pray that these women will dedicate their lives to the service of the church under the name Catholic Women Association (CWA).

Although priests and nuns are chosen from the people, they do not strictly speaking live among the people. The women who have been dedicated live among you, therefore they understand the hustle and bustle of daily living in the family. In the busy life they live, they will also attend to the support of the domestic Church in their homes and support the parish n its work of evangelization. I can clearly see a new Pentecost in our parish. Just as Jesus appreciated the generosity of women and defended them against those who ridiculed their acts of love, I pray that these women and many others will continue to strengthen our parish with their faith and dedication to Jesus who has called them to make provision for him from their own resources.

YOU ARE MOST WELCOME to our Parish Church. If it is your first time here or probably you have been here before, your presence with us at this moment at our community worship is greatly appreciated. Our Parish Church is the second to be built in Coventry after the Protestant Reformation. It was built in 1893, the pews have never moved since then! Our Musical Pipe Organ was inaugurated in 1898, it was the best of its kind at the time. Our Parish has had eleven Parish priests since 1889, the present one being a Religious Missionary from the Institute of Apostles of Jesus in Uganda. Our Parish welcomes and promotes the initiatives taken by everyone for the building up and sustenance of our faith community.
