WHAT CAN SEPARATE US FROM THE LOVE OF CHRIST?

The place where Jesus fed 5000 men without counting women and children is deserted even today. It overlooks the Sea of Galilee also called Sea of Tiberias. All that you see there, are the huge millstones. It was here that Jesus corrected the attitude of his disciples when a good time keeper among the Apostles told him: '*Wind-up your teaching, it is getting late, people have nowhere to sleep and there is no food for them here, please send them away so that they can go and take care of themselves.*' This was the attitude of the apostles and possibly ours too, but what did he say? Don't send them away, provide these things yourselves!

Jesus corrects a tendency that we have as well, namely to find other people to solve the problems that we have met. If the bathroom light is not working some people go to the priest and say: oh the light is not working. If the grass grows everywhere they tell the priest, oh the grass needs cutting! When someone dumps litter in the compound, they go and say, oh father, that litter needs to be taken away. When someone shows interest in the church, they say to the priest, oh so and so is interested in the faith could you visit him? What about when someone is sick? They don't go to see the person but they go and say please so and so needs a visit!

Jesus tells us; go and do something yourself. Why should you expect others to do it, yes you can do it, you can feed these people, you can keep them safe through the night, there is no need for them to go away. In other words we should not be observers because God knows that we can do something to make the situation better.

The 2nd reading deals with the perennial pastoral problem of suffering among the early Christians. They faced so many problems some of which are mentioned by St. Paul. The common ones at that time being threats, persecutions and death. Sometimes we tend to think that faith serves as an insurance policy against suffering, but there is no justification for this because Jesus tells us to take up our crosses and follow him.

The call to respond to situations of need that Jesus addresses to us today in the statement '*Give them something to eat yourselves*' will always be challenging. But St. Paul reflecting on the love of Jesus manifested on the cross, the redemptive act of the Father wondered what could separate us from the love of Christ!

Paul enumerates 10 cosmic powers death, life, angel, prince, things that exist, things still to come, powers or heights or depths, or any created thing can come between us and the love of God made visible in Christ Jesus our Lord. Paul does not say that we are immune to the onslaught of these, but for the love of Jesus what can separate us from him?

Some people have left the church or rejected the faith for love of this world, I know also of some political and religious leaders who suffocate the truth for fear of their positions but the question is: Who and what can separate us from the Love of Christ?

YOU ARE MOST WELCOME to our Parish Church. If it is your first time here or probably you have been here before, your presence with us at this moment at our community worship is greatly appreciated. Our Parish Church is the second to be built in Coventry after the Protestant Reformation. It was built in 1893, the pews have never moved since then! Our Musical Pipe Organ was inaugurated in 1898, it was the best of its kind at the time. Our Parish has had eleven Parish priests since 1889, the present one being a Religious Missionary from the Institute of Apostles of Jesus in Uganda. Our Parish welcomes and promotes the initiatives taken by everyone for the building up and sustenance of our faith community.

MATTERS OF IMPORTANCE

Daily Reflection on the lives of the Saints: during the lockdown our life was tested in different ways and our call to witness was much in demand. As your parish priest, I started an initiative to read to you the life of at least one saint everyday with the hope that reflecting on their life, we could get some inspiration to persevere in our own challenges of life. Please note that everyday at 8:45am except on Sunday, I read out through the webcam the life of a saint normally randomly chosen. Thanks to the parishioners who tune in to listen to that reading which they have described as truly inspirational. The reading of the Life of Saints is followed by Holy Rosary at 9:00am and Holy Mass at 9:30am. Please join us if you can.

The 106th World Day of Migrants and Refugees will be celebrated on **27 September 2020** under the theme chosen by the Holy Father: **"Forced like Jesus Christ to flee"**. The message will focus on the pastoral care of internally displaced people (IDPs), who currently number over 41 million worldwide. The theme originates in the experience of the young Jesus and his family as displaced persons and refugees. This experience provides a specific Christological grounding for the Christian action of welcome or hospitality. Over the coming months, the theme will be developed in six sub-themes expressed in six pairs of verbs: *to know in order to understand; to draw near so as to serve; to listen in order to reconcile; to share and thus to grow; to involve in order to promote; and finally, to collaborate and therefore to build.* Please let us remember the refugees in our prayers who like Jesus Christ are Forced to flee.

Safeguarding Volunteer Officer required: This is a sensitive role in the parish for the safety of our children and vulnerable adults in our community. I'm asking you if anyone could help to volunteer being a safeguarding representative officer for the parish to let me know. Training for this work will be offered by the parish and the diocese. Kindly let me know if you are willing to support the parish in this capacity.

Invocation of the Uganda Martyrs in our daily prayers: since the lockdown, you might have heard us adding the Uganda Martyrs among the Saints we invoke daily. Well when a virus disease called sleeping sickness caused by Tsetse flies swept through Uganda in 1900, the people turned to the Uganda Martyrs for their intercession. The pandemic stopped although it had killed so many people. During this Covid-19, we too invoke the Uganda Martyrs asking God through their intercession to take this pandemic away.

Feasts of the week: *St. John Mary Vianney 4th Aug,* was born near Lyons, France. As a priest he was assigned to the parish of Ars-sur-Froman where he spent forty two years. He was outstanding for his steadfast care of souls, for his spirit of prauer and mortification, but above all, for his tireless dedication to the Sacrament of Penance. He spent most of his lie in the confessional, drawing energy from his intimate and constant friendship with our Lord in the Eucharist.

<u>6th Aug. Transfiguration of the Lord</u>: After six days Jesus took with him Peter, James and John the brother of James, and led them up a high mountain by themselves. There he was transfigured before them. Therefore, feast of the Transfiguration of Jesus Christ is a visible sign in the presence of reliable witnesses of the reality of the power of God and the glory, which is Christ Jesus.

<u>A Road to be named after Fr. Bob Wright</u> at a time when commemorative statues and plaques are under intense scrutiny, we have learned that Coventry City Council has decided to name a new road close to St John Fisher Church in memory of Fr Bob Wright, recognising the outstanding service he made over the years within and beyond the parish and its schools.
