BECOME A DEDICATED TEACHER TO A MISSIONARY

Some experiences we go through early in life, can be compared to a mother dialect, we cannot get rid of them, they influence our life either to the amusement of the people, or to their disgust.

A missionary priest carries baggage whose contents parishioners will never understand. Wherever he is sent, he takes with him the wealth of his culture, his homeland spirituality and expression of faith. He takes his ethnic taboos with him; there are foods he does not eat or which he considers a delicate cuisine which other people will not allow to be brought even near the door.

A missionary priest will never get rid of his foreign accent or avoid pronouncing people's names and places wrongly. He has no intention to offend; it is just a missionary baggage he cannot get rid of. The Holy spirit will guide your hearts and minds to understand what his mumbling mean.

Blessed Dominic Barberi was that kind of man, in spite of his sanctity, he had a heavy Italian accent that it was very difficult for the English people to understand what he was saying. For those who went to church to listen to a good Englishspeaking preacher, Fr. Dominic Berberi's church was a no-go area, but for those who sought to deepen their love for Jesus and to build his church, his heavy Italian accent and poor English vocabulary did not count. One of the men that overlooked all that, was John Henry Newman. He was a polished English man who was never put off by Fr. Barberi's mumbling in his homilies to find the right words.

Do not expect missionaries to speak or to behave like the natives. I recall as a small boy, how we used to teach, English, Irish, French and Italian missionaries how to speak our native languages. We did not laugh at them or stop going to church to listen to the Catechism they taught. As a matter of fact, the more mistakes they made, the more committed we were to help them to get it right.

Two parishes in our denary, St. Mary's and Benedict and Our Lady of Angels, Nuneaton, will receive missionary priests. They are coming to you in the name of the Lord with the baggage I mentioned above. I pray that the Spirit of the Lord will make every person in the two parishes to become a dedicated and tireless teacher to the missionaries that they are receiving. Remember the words of the Lord: "it is not you who speak, the Spirit of your Father speaks in you" (Matt. 10:20). Be sure of this, the people of both parishes have a heavy work ahead.
