WHICH PART DO YOU PLAY IN THIS DRAMA?



Since Palm Sunday gospel narratives turned into some kind of drama. What we call the Good news that was first preached by the apostles and later by the Christians was the sad story about Passion, Death and Resurrection of Jesus which brought about the triumph of human redemption. The evangelists were very careful to tell the story in detail: who did what, when and why.

In that drama, the Pharisees and Scribes hated him, together with the high priest Caiaphas they decided to kill him.

Contrary to hate a woman called Mary of Bethany loved him so much, she poured very expensive perfume over his feet and wiped them with her hair.

For love of money, a man called Judas Iscariot sold Jesus for 30 silver pieces. At the Last Supper, the first Holy Mass ever, the same Judas walked out before it was ended. Night had fallen.

We enter the garden of Gethsemane while he agonised internally, his friends were enjoying their sleep, and at his arrest all of them fled. This is the first part of our drama.

A hasty trial, is held and all except Nicodemus condemned him to death. Did he really commit the crimes? Not really. His best friend Peter denied him three times.

The Roman Governor Pontius Pilate knew that Jesus was innocent but he was afraid of the truth and to please the people he compromised it by condemning Jesus to death to please the people .

On the way to Calvary a woman called Veronica defied public opinion, she stepped forward and cleaned the face of a condemned man covered in sweat and blood. A man from Cyrene called Simon helped him to carry his cross. As he hanged on it one criminal abused him, the other begged to be remembered when Jesus came to his kingdom. Then Jesus died, his body was quickly buried and the curtain of his life was closed.

This story reflects the part that we play everyday in the life of Jesus. The Jesus story is real in our life as it happened more than 2000 years ago. In one way or the other, we represent the different personalities mentioned. In your relationship with him and with the church which of these actors best describes you and which one would you wish to be?

Brothers and Sisters today we stand before an empty tomb. For those who believe in Jesus no explanation is necessary, for those who do not believe in him, no explanation is possible. We are called to proclaim the risen Lord just like the angel sited on the stone that had covered his tomb, or like Jesus himself mistakenly taken to be a gardener or like the women who ran to the Apostles to tell them that he was risen. As Christians let us remember this; an empty tomb proves the resurrection but an empty church denies it. By practicing our faith may our life be a constant proclamation of his resurrection. Jesus goes ahead of us to the Heavenly Galilee let us in haste to meet him there.
