WORSHIP ME

We gather here to celebrate the season of grace when the focus is on our relationship with God and how we treat one another. Lent unlike other liturgical seasons of the Church puts us at the centre inviting each one to examine his / her personal response to God. It is a time to pray more, a time to minister to our neighbours, a moment when we curb self seeking desires and we place God above all else. Our readiness to turn back to God was marked by the ashes imposed on our heads last Wednesday as a sign of admission of our sin and of our readiness to amend our life. Lent is the springtime of all believers.

Our reflection on Lenten journey starts by reflecting on the 40 days of Jesus in the wilderness, he fasted for forty days and forty nights. He was praying. While we could say this was a sacred moment for the Lord, it was also the time that the devil was so close to him. He knew that at some point Jesus would be hungry. Hunger for anything can make us do nasty things. Do not surrender your soul to material wealth or worship it.

The Devil knew that Jesus was about to launch the mission given by his Father, power would be sweet in his hands instead of being a humble servant. So he showed him all the kingdoms, they belong to me worship me, power and domination.

Celebrity culture is not something of the present, it has been there even at the time of Jesus. Seeking fame, the desire to be noticed, to be taken as a special person is temptation. So Jesus, you can draw people to yourself by making yourself appear famous.

The temptations of Jesus explain our human condition. We know that the closer we want to do the will of God the more temptations we have to make us not to do it. The moment you will say that you want to follow Jesus and to accept the will of God, you will be surprised to discover a small devil within your life giving you all the reasons why you should ignore him. Our faith will not prevent the devil to approach us but it will help us to give the right answer to the tempter. "Man does not live on bread alone, you must worship God and serve him alone, you must not put God to the test."

The situation between Ukraine and Russia calls for our prayers. In the first reading we have heard the faith of the Jewish people in a God who saw their misery when they called on him for help. God heard their voice, saw their misery, their toil and their oppression and he liberated them. The oppressing powers like Egypt of old have not gone away. Such oppressors are of course inspired by the temptation to control power, to become wealthy or to appear important the very temptations Jesus had and overcame.

As you return home today I ask you to remember that the devil is not far from us and that he will use our ordinary circumstances to lead us astray. The devil is not that one with horns and vampire teeth, it can be someone, something or a situation that takes us away from God. Let us be vigilant and never get tired to call on God for help. Satan tempts us to worship idols other than God. Let us be vigilant to worship God alone always.

<u>Prayer for Ukraine:</u> the Polish Church on Springfield Road invites you to join them on Monday, March 7, for a 24-hour adoration of the Blessed Sacrament for peace in Ukraine. This prayer will begin with Holy Mass at 10.30 (Polish language) and end on Tuesday with Holy Mass at 10.30 (Polish language). We invite everyone to join this prayer initiative.

Specific notes for Lent and Easter:

On Holy Thursday, the Washing of the Feet as part of the rite of the Mandatum is restored. The celebrant should wear a face covering whilst performing this rite.

On Good Friday, the Veneration of the Cross is also restored. Those who approach the Cross, after making the customary reverence before it, can either touch the Cross in a devotional way or kiss the Cross provided that an alcoholic wipe is used to clean the place that is venerated after each kiss by the faithful.

The Easter Vigil is restored in its full Rite. The faithful gathering for the ceremonies can have candles and the baptismal liturgy can take place along with any associated confirmations. For the anointings as part of this, the thumb or a cotton bud can be used. The sprinkling of the faithful during the vidi aquam is permitted. Whilst the circulation of the virus continues in society, the clear direction of the UK Government is that after two years of restrictions and following the successful roll-out of the vaccination programme, the usual patterns of life should return. There should be vigilance at the local level in terms of viral infection and transmission and local adaptations should be put in place.
