ONLY THOSE PREPARED TO LOSE CAN FOLLOW JESUS CHRIST:

I'm sure you have played a game called "tag of war" if you have not it is interesting to watch. It goes like this: two groups of strong people decide to compete with each other by pulling a long rope between them. The opposing groups put up strong resistance against each other while the cheering supporters encourage them on. Finally one group will be overpowered and the winning side will take the losers as far as they wish. Usually the losers have no chance of putting up resistance, they're entirely at the mercy of the winners. As a child I remember how one day the wives in my village played a tag of war against their husbands. The losers were to cook food for their families a week before and after Christmas. This is a festive time, nobody wants to get stuck in the kitchen. The wives prepared themselves by turning up in large numbers and had many cheering supporters. Their husbands on the other hand spent the whole morning drinking alcohol since they were convinced that victory was theirs. They were ill prepared such that when the contest started they were defeated. They spent a fortnight over Christmas and New Year cooking for their families as the terms of the contest demanded.

In failure something good can also be found. Although the men had lost, they became servants to their families over Christmas for the first time. They took care of the children, provided and cooked food, they cleaned and washed up dishes after meals! This deepened the bond between them and their wives and it won the hearts of their children.

Jesus spoke of discipleship in terms of accepting loss so as to gain: by giving up ones possessions someone can become a true disciple (Lk. 14.33), by selling everything one owns he is able to acquire the pearl of great value (Matt 13:44-46) By leaving everything to follow him (Lk 5:11) they got a new name 'apostles' (Lk. 6:13). St. Paul writing to the Philippians reminded them that in order to gain Christ he 'accepted the loss of everything' (Phil. 3:8).

Society is obsessed with winning, to become the centre of attraction and attention is life ambition for many. Who wants to learn that he/she is a loser? Some people have gone to the extreme: I remember seeing a young man wearing tattoos all over the body, he was so disfigured that he looked more of an African leopard than a human person. I remember also seeing a group of girls scantly dressed; they looked as if Yahweh had just expelled them from the Garden of Eden!

The lure of winning has made some preachers to falsify the teaching of Jesus. His teaching demands empting oneself and become humble servants (Lk.22:27), to take up the cross daily (Lk. 9:23) or to wash each other's feet (Jn. 13:14). Instead they preach a gospel of salvation without the cross; a gospel of wealth without work, a gospel of forgiveness without repentance, a gospel of prosperity without others. Are you prepared to lose so as to gain Christ?

When we are ready to lose then we are ready to gain. The people we call successful are those who were once on the losing end. It were those people who sacrificed everything to follow Jesus who were promised a hundred fold in this world and in the next eternal life. In the end, it is only those willing to lose who can hope to gain.

YOU ARE MOST WELCOME to our Parish Church. If it is your first time here or probably you have been here before, your presence with us at this moment at our community worship is greatly appreciated. Our Parish Church is the second to be built in Coventry after the Protestant Reformation. It was built in 1893, the pews have never moved since then! Our Musical Pipe Organ was inaugurated in 1898, it was the best of its kind at the time. Our Parish has had eleven Parish priests since 1889, the present one being a Religious Missionary from the Institute of Apostles of Jesus in Uganda. Our Parish welcomes and promotes the initiatives taken by everyone for the building up and sustenance of our faith community.
