BE CAREFUL WHEN YOU REJECT SOMEONE/ SOMETHING

From the time Jesus rose from the dead, the disciples seem to have had a thinking that the Pascal mysteries were meant exclusively for the people of Israel. Jesus had appeared to them on several occasions and told them to go and preach the Good news to all. The sermons given by Peter either to the Sanhedrin or to the crowds at Pentecost appealed to the Jews to turn to God. There seem to be no room for the pagans. However, as we have heard in the first reading, the Jews did not realise God's gift to make them instrument of his salvation. By doing so, it became an opportunity for the pagans to receive their share in the saving plan of God. God's plans are mysterious, if the Jews had accepted the gospel message, all of us who are not Jews would not probably have known Jesus Christ. Christianity itself would have remained a tiny sect within Judaism. But God has a plan what others throw away as useless, can be the greatest gift that the other person could ever have in life.

I remember a man who used to abuse his wife, and to belittle her in public. He divorced her, she returned to her home heartbroken. The man got married to someone he thought was his dream wife. The new woman became a real thorn in the life of the man. Well, the woman who was thrown away by her husband prospered and became a blessing in the life of the people in the village. The man begged her to return but it was too late.

This is what happens when we do not recognise that, what we are, what we have, the people in our lives, the jobs we have, the families to which we belong, the faith we profess and the church to which we belong, are gifts of God given to us for our pilgrimage in this life.

Today is Good Shepherd Sunday and we pray for vocations. In the gospel, the imagery of Jesus as the shepherd and each of us being the sheep of his flock reminds us of the personal care he gives to us individually and personally. If we really belong to him, it is our duty to listen to him and to follow him by keeping his commandments.

As you return home today, remember that God has an exciting life planned for you. It is a life of significance and relevance, a life loaded with eternal consequence, a life that is possible for you alone. God has given you a vocation in this life. All you need is an open and willing heart.

Go and count your blessings, you are created complete, what you have is enough, do not be envious of others. Many times we envy others because of what they have made out of what we threw away yesterday. The family relationship you carelessly handle today will be your envy when you see families settled in peace. The money you squander will be the cause of envy for those who use it carefully.

As your priest, I ask you to think broadly and not to consider yourself as someone that is lacking. The Lord helps you to understand your mission and your vocation as you spend time in prayer and reflection. While his direction is not always easy or convenient, it will be possible because he sustains you. He formed you and knows everything about you, including what is and is not possible for you.

<u>Vocations</u> <u>Sunday</u>: Today we celebrate <u>Vocations</u> <u>Sunday</u> or <u>Good Shepherd Sunday</u>, and is marked as the <u>World Day of Prayer for Vocations</u>. The purpose of this day is to fulfil Jesus' instruction to "*Pray the Lord of the harvest to send labourers into his harvest*" (Matthew 9:38). While appreciating all vocations, the Church concentrates her attention on raising up shepherds for God's people - vocations to Holy Orders (the priesthood and diaconate) and to the religious life - while encouraging all who are discerning their vocation to pray more earnestly that they may hear and respond to God's call.

<u>Appeal for Ukraine:</u> To support our brothers and sisters of Ukraine most of them are refugees in different countries need our financial help. Therefore the Archbishop has requested that parishes old a 2nd collection this coming Sunday for the displaced people of Ukraine.

Would you like to share your faith with others by teaching Catechism? Catechesis is a ministry of teaching and forming that passes on the Word of God to inform the Catholic community and candidates for initiation into the Church about the teachings of Christ, transmitted by the Apostles to the Church.

<u>Toilet repairs:</u> I'm sorry to observe again that parish property is not handled with care, this is especially noticed in the parish toilet chambers where toilets are broken from time to time. The parish spent £1,140.00 this week to put new ones, you can imagine how much we shall spend if we have to replace them every two months or less! This abuse is so common in the ladies side.

<u>First Holy Communion</u>: Our Parish and School children will be receiving their First Holy Communion on Saturday 21st May at 10.30am. Let us support them through our prayers.

Energy Bills: as you know the cost of heating and lighting has gone high and it will continue to go even higher. Please try your best to save energy as much as you can.

<u>For Gas</u> turn your thermostats at least 1 or 2 degrees lower. When you are coming to Church put on some extra warm clothing.

For electricity: turn off lights when the room is not in use, replace lightbulbs with LED bulbs, unplug or switch off non-essential equipment when not in use.

Our parish has a very big space to light up or to heat up. Please let us cooperate in minimising the amount of money we spend on these essential provisions.
