" HABEMUS PAPAM - YOU HAVE A FATHER!"

I remember the night very well when Pope Benedict XVI was elected. The whole world had fixed its eyes on that ancient small chimney over the Sistine Chapel where the conclave was seated. Some world leaders, capable of placing their finger on a nuclear button and trigger a nuclear war, and commoners like me and you, were placed on the same level; all their eyes were on that small chimney. All of us were ignorant of what will come out of the closed doors of the Sistine Chapel. The world was united in speculation, in gossip and for many Christians in prayer. The Catholic Church was praying for someone who would steer the old aged boat of Simon Peter the fisherman.

As we started to feel drowsy, Sister Leena claimed to have seen white smoke billowing from the chimney. It is said that white smoke announces the successful election of a new Pope. Fr. Aloysius Bukenya comes from Uganda. He is a very good man who will lead our parish in a very good way. He did his Masters and PhD degree at Warwick University. He was first appointed parish priest of St. Elizabeth Foleshill by Archbishop Vincent Nichols, but could not carry on his appointment because of visa issue. He returned to Africa where he served in sensitive offices including being a rector of the Theological Major Seminary of the Institute of A.J, he was Regional Superior for the whole of Kenya, at the time of his new appointment to St. Marys, he was Dean, School of Graduate Studies, Research and Innovation at University of Kisubi in Uganda. He is also presently a member of the core group studying the Constitutions of the religious Institute of the Apostles of Jesus.
