#### THE KINGDOM OF GOD IS AMONG PEOPLE ON THE MARGINS NOT AT THE CENTRE

In the ancient world, the horse was a war machine compared to what the American Abraham war tanks are today. It symbolised power, domination, subjugation and prestige. The very sight of a man coming down along the same road, required that the person riding on it had the right of way. The more horses someone owned, the more was the tendency to subjugate others. It was a tempting machine.

The first reading speaks about the arrival of the saviour sent by Yahweh to the people of Israel. Contrary to the popular thinking, God used an unfamiliar approach: the Messiah comes riding on a donkey instead of the horse. This would have disheartened the oppressed people, because a donkey was not a war machine but a beast of burden used for domestic and farm work.

There is a teaching that God wanted to give to the oppressed people of Israel: namely that, liberation, victory and freedom does not come from the people but it is a gift of Yahweh to them. It does not take long to find persons who lay claim of their success to their personal efforts, proper planning and careful saving regime excluding God's intervention. The truth is that, when we hold this view or entertain this attitude, we are greatly mistaken because it is God at work.

In the Gospel something unexpected happened. Jesus had randomly chosen the Seventy two disciples and sent them out. They were aware of the hostile world ahead of them and how inadequately prepared they were. Once they accepted the mission, the results were fantastic to the extent that even demons gave in to them in submission! Jesus did something which most of us would unlikely do, he raised his voice in prayer and thanked his heavenly Father. Probably all of would claim such success or attribute it to something. Jesus instead, attributed it to God

Another important lesson we learn in today's gospel is the overwhelming power of God which is at work among people on the margins. Surely the Seventy two disciples could not believe it either that the mission would bear such fruits. Jesus teaches us that when we open up to do God, he empowers us to fulfil it. It is Him at work not us.

I'm sure that each one of us will at some point feel like a grasshopper in front of a given task, but the most important thing is to trust that he who gives us a task wants it to end in success rather than in a failure because, as the Second reading assured us, the Spirit of God who raised Jesus from the dead is alive and at work in us.

Let us constantly recognise that Jesus works more among the people on the margins rather than those at the centre. "I bless you Father Lord of heaven and earth for hiding these things from the learned and clever and revealed them to mere children". We should not despise or belittle ourselves but instead cooperate with the grace of God in all things we do.

### **Gospel Reflection**

The readings of today invite us to reflect on peace and consolation through the Word of God. This word reveals to us and shows us that God is all powerful and mighty and yet is always accessible. In the First Reading from the Book of Zechariah the prophet invites the Israelites for a sincere service to God. He evokes God's protective care as he promises the coming of our King into Jerusalem, truly humble. He will proclaim peace for the nations. He is a king of peace, not just in the sense of an external absence of violence but of a deep, inner peace, shalom.

Paul in his letter to the Romans reminds us of the choice between two possible principles by which we can live: one is to live by the flesh and the other to live by the Spirit.

Today we have the message from Jesus to come to him and receive the rest he alone can give. It is a call to a personal relationship. He takes us away from the impersonal relationship of law to a personal relationship of love and makes us enter a joyful life giving relationship. In coming to the person of Jesus we discover that far from being burdened, we are fully liberated. He invites us to place the yoke of ours on our shoulders and follow him.
