### 2nd Sunday of Advent -Year A Parish Newsletter: 8th—15th December 2019

#### SOMEONE IS ASKING FOR YOUR VOTE DO YOU KNOW WHAT HE STANDS FOR?

The Catholic Bishops' of England and Wales have issued a statement on the forth-coming General Election having returned from their November 2019 Plenary meeting in Leeds. The statement concentrates on the key issues – not parties or manifestos – offering a series of points that can be put to candidates prior to voting.

It is a duty of all citizens – not just Catholics – to help shape politics that is "rooted in the service of human rights and peace". The human dignity of all – particularly the vulnerable and those on the margins – lies at the heart of the statement as the Bishops. They encourage you to put these issues to those seeking for your vote." In making judgments about how to vote, the Bishops recommend that you ask the candidates for their position on the following:

What is the candidates position on the dignity of every human being; including the child in the womb.?

What is the candidates position on the dignified care for the terminally ill and dying on assisted suicide or euthanasia?

What is the candidates position on the needs of those who are frequently neglected by society such as people with disabilities, Travellers, older people, those who are homeless, those in prison and those trapped in modern slavery?

What is the candidates position on integration of migrants and refugees who have made their homes here. Does he/she, challenge the global rise of xenophobia and racism that is so radically incompatible with our faith? What about the rights of those in our own communities and overseas who "can see no end to the tunnel of extreme poverty," providing them with assistance and confronting the structural injustices that compound their suffering?

What is the candidates position on care for our common home and climate change which threatens the future of our entire human family and is already having a profound impact upon the world's poorest people?

What is the candidates position on freedom of religion and belief, ensuring that everyone has the right to exercise their conscience and practise their creed freely without fear? The right of parents to educate their children in accordance with their faith and support the work of Catholic schools in their contribution to society and their promotion of the common good? Does he/she recognise marriage and the family as having an essential place in the service of life and society? YOU ARE MOST WELCOME to our Parish Church. If it is your first time here or probably you have been here before, your presence with us at this moment at our community worship is greatly appreciated. Our Parish Church is the second to be built in Coventry after the Protestant Reformation. It was built in 1893, the pews have never moved since then! Our Musical Pipe Organ was inaugurated in 1898, it was the best of its kind at the time. Our Parish has had eleven Parish priests since 1889, the present one being a Religious Missionary from the Institute of Apostles of Jesus in Uganda. Our Parish welcomes and promotes the initiatives taken by everyone for the building up and sustenance of our faith community.
