THIS PAINTING OVER OUR HEADS: THE RETURN OF THE PRODIGAL SON

In the church of Ss. Mary and Benedict, the Jubilee Shrine for the Year of Mercy in Coventry, hangs a huge painting of the picture of the Return of the prodigal Son by a 17th Century Dutch artist Rembrandt. For us who are looking at this painting now and for those who will visit this Shrine of Mercy I want to use this column to serialise the reflections of Henri Nouwen from his book *The Return of the Prodigal Son*. The original painting was acquired by Catherine the Great for a hermitage in St. Peterburg



Russia, where it remains today. The painting is based on the parable of Jesus given by Luke. Henri Nouwen spent hours in front of this painting.

The painting represents the spiritual home-coming of all mankind. The sinful child is being welcomed by his/her father. Lift your eyes and look at the painting: to one side the elder brother looks on and in the background are other unknown people who, like ourselves contemplate the scene. This painting is about mercy, as you pray here consider which person you identify with most. Are you the Father receiving an errant son, or the elder brother indignant because his brother has returned? How do you feel about each character? Which one most resembles your own feelings at this time? Just in one word what do you see as you look at the prodigal son, ...as you look at the father what touches your attitude?

Let us focus on the father. This is a painting of a man in a great red cloak tenderly touching the shoulders of a dirty untidy boy kneeling before him. What we see in the painting is the father and a son, God and humanity, compassion and misery, in one circle of love.... The mystery of death and life, reconciliation, forgiveness and inner healing. The Year of Mercy gives us an amnesty to seek reconciliation, to grant forgiveness, to find peace. "I have come to set fire on earth," Jesus said, "and how I wish it was blazing already!"
