Instead of being eager to reform other people by criticizing them, we become more concerned with understand them. Wild dreams are no more, in old age we live more in the present and less in the future.

I do not know how many people appreciate getting old these days, the more some work against it, the more frustrating it becomes. However I know that unless we get old there will be no opportunity for us to see your children grow or to see your children's children. These are the things that make us complete in this life. While the outer man may look as if falling apart, the inner man remains strong and youthful. Old age is not a time of life instead it is a quality of the mind.
