Stations of the Cross are celebrated at 6pm every Friday during the season of Lent.

THE SYMBOL OF THE CROSS OF CHRIST FOR CHRISTIANS

In all human life, to achieve any goal or life objective, we are expected to spend some time, energy, comforts and resources. Children and students do this in their academic growth, parents make efforts in all areas to promote and support their children, and teachers spend time preparing lessons to instruct their pupils. Sports men and women work hard to keep up their standards by regular physical exercises to keep fit. Engineers, both on terrestrial and interplanetary projects, try their best to make better machines to meet the world's standards. In all these undertakings something important is given to gain a higher benefit.

In the Gospel today, Christ said if you love your life, you will lose it; if you give it up in this world you will gain eternal life (Jn.12:25). The gospel prepares us to understand the meaning of the passion and the death of Christ on the Cross as climaxed on Good Friday. This was the greatest love God showed to humanity and to the entire creation. In the incarnation event, God joined our humanity with Him in love, but on the Cross, He gave up himself completely, in life and in death, to redeem us for eternal life for both the dead and the living; whether alive or dead we belong to him (Rm. 14:7-9). His passion and death on the cross was preceded by the example of service he showed when he washed the feet of the disciples at the Last Supper (Jn.13:1-20). These events were practical teachings of the Lord to his followers, to be extended to all generations in this world. He commissioned them after the resurrection, "go forth to the whole world and baptise everyone who believes" (Mk.16:14-17)

The Cross of Christ, therefore, invites us Christians to love without reservation, to be generous, charitable, just, faithful, committed, forgiving, tolerant and humble. We are called to give up some of our energies and resources for the needy in our society and to support our faith activities in the world to extend the mission of Cross of Christ in this world.
