**Solemnity of Christ the King:** Coming Sunday is the conclusion of the Liturgical Year of the Church and Solemnity of Christ the King. The other Sunday will be the beginning of the New liturgical year with Advent season. As a city, to begin this season there will be the **Blessing the Christmas Crib** on 3rd December 2017 at the precincts near Marks & Spencer at 4:00pm. Let us be there in large numbers to launch Christmas in our city. Also St John's is holding an Advent Carol Service at 4:30pm and you are invited to join in on the way home from the Blessing of the Crib.

**Sunday Nov 19th is the first 'World Day of the Poor'.** Pope Francis has instituted this new day as a way of inviting us to understand that sharing with those living in poverty "enables us to understand the deepest truth of the Gospel". **World Meeting of Families 2018:** Next year there will be a meeting of families conference in Ireland. Over 1,200 individuals have already registered from around Ireland and from 40 countries across the world, including Albania, Argentina, Austria, Bahrain, Belgium, Brazil, China, England, France, Germany, Libya, Nigeria, Pakistan, Peru, Qatar, Scotland, Spain, Uganda, USA and Wales. The benefits of volunteering as a group include: sharing the volunteering experience with your friends/colleagues, being in the same venue and at the same times, the possibility of travelling together, etc. To volunteer as a group, all you need to do is choose a group name and your group leader's name; and enter this on your online application. Everyone within that group needs to enter the same group name when they are filling in their Volunteer Online application form. So please invite and encourage as many people from your communities as you can to join our Volunteering Team for this once in a lifetime event.

**National Youth Sunday** is celebrated on the solemnity of Christ the King 26th Nov. 2017. This is an important event for all Diocesan Youth Services and especially the Kenelm Youth Trust in the Archdiocese of Birmingham. The Kenelm Youth Trust is committed to providing life changing opportunities for young people, helping each person to reflect upon their life of faith and how they respond to the call of Jesus in their lives. These include retreats, a wide range of youth events, summer camps, pilgrimages etc. There will be a second collection next week to support the youth activities in the diocese.



#### **WHILE YOU ARE SAVED DON'T SIT BACK AND SAY IT IS COMPLETE**

While conversing with someone about faith during the week, he spoke to me of his experience of how he was "ambushed" by a certain gentleman who knocked at his door with a question "*Are you Saved*"? Well there are questions that you would expect from a caller at the door, but when a question of that kind is the first greeting of a stranger, you might not have a straight answer. "*Are you saved*" is a question we often hear from well-meaning Christians who want to help others to know Jesus Christ. I'm sure you have been asked that question or even laughed at by those who claim to have been instantaneously saved. As Catholics whose faith is rooted in and centred on Jesus, we appreciate their good intentions and admire their willingness to talk about God and about Jesus.

Many Catholics may have trouble understanding what the question is really about. Catholic students and pupils might feel isolated and lost not knowing what to say. Some see it as a Pentecostal Evangelical slogan. What do people mean exactly when they talk of being already "saved"?

Christians with this slogan on their lips see salvation as a past event that took place when they made a confession of faith in Jesus at baptism. Many of them take it for granted that this act of faith guarantees them now a place in heaven no matter what they may do for the rest of their lives as long as you confess Jesus as your Lord and Saviour salvation is guaranteed. The consequence is that some of them get involved in activities which Catholics may consider offensive to God.

The Catholic teaching helps us to understand that this is a mistaken notion of salvation. Salvation in the fullest sense is an ongoing process that won't be complete until we come into the presence of God. Yes we are saved but not yet since there is a possibility of turning away from God through mortal sin.

When someone asks you whether you're "saved," perhaps the best short answer is this: "Well, I'm 'working for my salvation day by day'" (see Phil 2:12) our goal is to be counted among the saints in heaven. Salvation is not just a past event instead it is a daily transformation of oneself into the likeness of God in our life which will reach its fullness when we come into his presence.

We're like the survivors of a shipwreck in a storm out in mid-ocean. We've been rescued from drowning and welcomed on-board the ship we call the Church. That ship is now taking us to a safe harbour — our home in heaven with God. But we're not home yet. Remember to work for your salvation in fear and trembling' Phil. 2:12.
