
From the Headteacher's office: a number of children are regularly collected late from school at the end of the day. Parents are responsible for their child every day from 3.15pm unless other arrangements are in place eg After School Club. Whilst we understand that one-off emergencies may arise, it is not acceptable for school staff to be expected to supervise children on a regular basis because they are not being collected on time and this is a welfare issue. Therefore as a school from this term we are introducing a £5 fine for up to each 15 minutes that we have to supervise a child that has not been collected from the playground by the usual time. This already happens in many other local schools. Persistent late collectors may also risk a referral to social care as this is classed as neglect of parental responsibility and also potentially losing their child's place at school. 

I LEFT THE CATHEDRAL STRENGTHENED

On the Wednesday of Holy Week 12th April Archbishop Bernard Longley presided over a Chrism Mass in the presence of his brother bishops and priests. In the presence of the bishop and the people the priests renewed their promises to serve God and his people as ministers of the Word and Sacraments. 'Presence' in our Christian faith tradition is not simply the body being here or there but the involvement of the whole person in the action taking place. Thus in the presence of the bishop and the people, the priests renewed their promise to be devoted to you. The Easter event revealed the generosity of God. The Archbishop asked us to draw inspiration and courage from the words of Bl. John Henry Newman who said:

'Let us pray for each other, as well as for ourselves, that the gifts He has given us may not be squandered on ourselves, and used for our own gratification or our own reputation, but for His glory and for the good of His Church.'

He spoke of the importance of the cross: *'The cross lies at the center of everything we believe as priests and it gives meaning to everything we teach. Christ has always seen our capacity to shoulder his cross for the sake of others, lifting their burdens and lightening their hearts.'* Even though, *'we may not recognize this fully or clearly within ourselves.'*

He emphasized how it is important for all to come together for the Chrism Mass because *'It is not good for us as priests to be isolated – it jars against the nature of our calling.'* Adding that the Chrism Mass is a time when, *'the priests renew and refresh their relationship with the Lord as his priests in the midst of the Church – and where they also re-commit themselves to take care of their brothers in the priesthood.'*

The Archbishop prayed that friendships amongst priests 'may be a source of encouragement and inspiration' and called for 'understanding and acceptance of those priests who may be struggling with their health, with physical or mental frailty, with discouragement or disappointment.' He spoke of his need for our prayers in his ministry. I don't know when you last prayed for your priests. During this time of stress and cynicism towards the priesthood I encourage you to pray for your priest because it is not easy to be a priest these days. If your priest is doing well, pray for him, if he is not doing well as you would like him to, pray for him, maybe it is because you do not remember him in your prayers. Get involved in his ministry by supporting him, the rest leave it to God.

Crib Money and Masses for Holy Souls: as I mentioned to you last year, the Catholic Church in Cuba has been granted some (limited) freedom to evangelise the people. The Apostles of Jesus missionaries are among the Institutes that have started to plant the church in Cuba but they need our support following decades of communism and atheism under Fidel Castro. The Holy Masses which you requested for, for Holy Souls have been sent to our missionaries in Cuba to support them in their work. There was £71.37 from the crib collection and £435.00 for the Holy Souls Masses. All totalling to £506.37. The names of your dear ones for whom the Masses will be celebrated have been sent to the priests in Cuba as well. At every Mass offered the priests will mention the name of the person for whom the sacrifice of the Mass will be offered and call on the people to pray for the repose of their souls. I thank you for accepting to participate in the rebuilding up of the Catholic faith in Cuba.
