

Daily Prayer in the family: may I ask the parents to teach their children to pray. The best way to do so is for the children to see you praying. There are many cases showing that children reach the age of First Holy Communion, even Confirmation without knowing how to make the Sign of the Cross! There are also increasing cases of anger and misunderstandings within our families simply because spouses do not spend time with each other in prayer. Remember the saying "A family that prays together, and eats together, lives together."

Gift Aid Donation: as you might notice from our newsletter bulletin, the number of the parishioners who donate to the church through Gift Aid has gone down. Gift Aid Scheme is a golden chance given to UK taxpayers to claim £0.25 pence on every pound they give to charity. Your parish being a charity gets that money back as a support by the government to your chosen charity. If you are already in the Gift Aid Scheme, thank you so much but remember to use your G.A envelope whenever you come to Church. Please note that if you happen to go to Sunday Mass to another Church in Coventry please use your envelope there since the priest in that parish will send it to your parish.

Life in the Spirit seminar is entering its 8th and final week. Talks were being held at Christ the King parish bringing up all parishes in Coventry towards spiritual renewal. Some members of our parish have attended them which was very good of them to do. The final meeting will be on Thursday 8th June starting at 7:00pm. All are welcome.

The 48 Diocesan Pilgrimage to Hednesford in honour of Our Lady will take place on Sunday 2 July 2017.



THE FIRST MEMBERS OF THE CHURCH.

When we talk about the Catholic Church some people think that it is one of the sects just like many Christian sects we have around. But it is not. The Catholic Church is Catholic because from the beginning her first members came from all over the known world excluding none. She accepted everyone who wanted to believe in Jesus men or women slaves or citizens alike. But who were the first members of the Church on Pentecost day? Where did they come from? Today's 1st Reading talks about their origins:

Parthia is a region in north-eastern Iran. It was the political and cultural base of the Arsacid dynasty (247 BC – 224 AD) which occupied the whole of modern Iran, Iraq and Armenia, parts of Turkey, Georgia, Azerbaijan, Turkmenistan, Afghanistan, Tajikistan Pakistan and Syria.

The **Medes** were a people who lived in Media north western Iran between 1000 BC to around 900 BC. They spoke the Median language.

Mesopotamia is a territory between rivers Tigris and Euphrates it corresponds to Iraq, Kuwait the eastern parts of Syria and southern Turkey. It is the site of the earliest civilization in human history including the invention of the wheel the planting of the first cereal crops, the invention of cursive script, mathematics, astronomy and agriculture.

Judeans were people who had come from the mountainous southern part of Canaan.

Cappadocia is present day Turkey it means "the country of beautiful horses"

Pontus is a region on the southern coast of the Black Sea located in modern eastern Turkey. **Phrygia** was a kingdom in the central part of Turkey on the Sakarya River.

Asia, Indians, Japanese, Koreans, Chinese were all members of the first church on Pentecost Day. There were visitors from Rome may be to represent the Europeans.

Cyrene is Libya. On the first day the church started, the Africans joined it. The man who helped Jesus to carry his Cross was an African from Libya. Africa not only gave sanctuary to Jesus as a refugee, it helped him also to carry his cross. As we celebrate Pentecost today it is good to know that when the Church first began, you were represented. From the very beginning she was Catholic (universal) and Catholic she must be. The Catholic Church is not a sect but a Mother. If she has lived for so long and endured so much, it means that Pentecost was not a one-off event even here and now God continues to strengthen us with the consolation of the Holy Spirit.
