ST. OSBURG CHURCH ACCOUNTS YEAR ENDED 31 DECEMBER 2016


You are a generous parish. You gave £30,000 in offertory collections; and £20,000 in donations. You gave £4,000 in diocesan second collections, £1,500 for CAFOD fast days, and £3,200 to CAFOD through the Friday lunches. You gave to the parish £3,600 through the Saturday lunches and £4,000 through the 300 club. You raised £700 through the Piety stall. Yet we have big costs; church property maintenance cost us £13,000.00, Heating cost £13,000.00, Diocesan levies took £12,500 and Insurance £4,200. Through your generosity and careful cost management by Fr Jimmy, we have managed to reduce our bank overdraft from £529,000 to £506,000. Reducing our debt by £23,000 is great achievement; particularly as offertory collections have fallen 25% over the last four years.

The Future

The Church is in good state. The priest's house has been made liveable. The leaking gutters, the damp, the draughty windows and the rusty cast iron baths have all been addressed. Several rooms have been let to students bringing in rental income, this year of £6,000. The next challenge is the hall and club. These are great assets which we must use to the best effect. Looking forward, we have a very long way to go, but with our two new priests, Fr Sunday and Fr. Pontius, there is a palpable sense that St. Osburg's has a great future. If you have any ideas on how to improve our finances, please speak to the finance committee members, Fr. Parish Newsletter—2nd Sunday of Lent Year A - 12th—19th Mar 2017

IF IT IS A BAD IDEA, IT IS MY DUTY TO LET YOU KNOW

I would like to thank you all for the generosity you show towards the parish through your financial support. Many of you work for long hours, others switch from one job to the other so as to make ends meet. As you work hard to put food at the table and a roof over your head, the government taxes your income with which it provides us with the services we all need such as health care, education etc... The government operates a scheme called Gift Aid that allows charities to claim 0.25p for every pound donated. Take Joseph as an example; he is working and he pays tax on his income. Today he put £10.00 in the collection. Since he has not signed a Gift Aid form, his donation remains just £10.00. If Joseph had signed the Gift Aid Form, the government would have refunded to him £2.50 to benefit the church (charity) to which he made the £10.00 donation which means that the church would have received £12.50 at no extra cost to Joseph. If you are in work and tax is deducted on your income, giving your Sunday donation under Gift Aid means that so much more money can be raised by the parish with relatively little effort.

The gift aid rules require the completion and signing of a Gift Aid form which is available for you to complete today. This provides us with the information required for the parish to claim tax from the government taken on your donation. To ensure that the Gift Aid is valid, (meaning we can claim the money back), it's vitally important that all the information asked for on the Gift Aid Declaration Form is provided. In our case your full names, address and signature. Gift Aid does not deal with how much you earn or with how much you spend, all it does is for the church to appreciate the donation you give and to claim refund from the government which taxes your income.

When the parish receives a donation from a UK taxpayer, we are entitled to claim an amount of tax (calculated at the basic rate of income tax in that tax year) paid on that donation. Once you have given your permission for us to do this on your behalf (by signing the Gift Aid form), there is no need for you to do anything else. All that is required is that the amount of tax you pay in a given tax year is at least equal to the amount of tax claimed by the parish in that same year. The amount the parish claims is £0.25 pence on every pound you donate, this makes 25% of the total value of your donations in that tax year. The more you use your Gift Aid envelope on Sunday, the larger the amount the parish can claim. If your tax situation changes and your gifts no longer be eligible for the Gift Aid scheme please tell us and we will amend your record accordingly.

In the last 4 tax years, St. Osburg has been able to receive an additional income from Gift Aid of £13,616.00 and St. Marys is expecting to receive £17,096.50 in the same period. Thanks to all those who give their Sunday collection through Gift Aid Scheme. If Gift Aid Scheme was a bad idea, it would be my duty to let you know.
